1 Population Characteristics

Summary:


- The population of Malinslee increased by just 2.1% between 2001 and 2011, with a population density of 23.2, four times the Borough wide population density of 5.7.
- In the decade prior to the 2011 Census, the 65+ population of the ward increased slightly from 11.1% to 11.9%.
- Malinslee's population is younger than the Borough picture with larger proportions of those aged under 35, particularly 0-4 year olds.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Malinslee increased by 56.7% between 2001 and 2011, representing 9.6% of the population, slightly less than the 10.6% seen across the Borough.
- Beside White British, the 'Other White' population is now the largest in the ward at 2.9%, having increased from 1.4% in 2001 but still slightly lower than Borough-wide (4.2%).
- The proportion of Christians in the ward decreased from 71.1% to 55.7% between 2001 and 2011, but remained the largest religious group in the ward, albeit lower than the Borough proportion of 61.7%.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Some 3.3% of Malinslee residents have a main language other than English, slightly lower than the 4.1% seen Borough wide.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 2,434 occupied household spaces in Malinslee accommodating 6,086 people, an average household size of 2.50, just above the 2.47 seen Borough wide.
- Since 2001, the proportion of one person households has decreased from 28.8% to 27.8%, but remains above the Borough rate of 25.2%
- The largest household type in the ward is 'other' (not aged 65 and over' one person households at a rate of 17.6%, higher than the Borough wide 14.5%.
- More than a third (34.4%) of households in Malinslee have no access to a car or van, considerably higher than the Borough wide figure (20.6%).
- One in nine households (11.1%) are deprived in three or four dimensions, almost double the 5.9% of households in this position Borough wide.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The total number of household spaces in Malinslee has increased by 50 since 2001 with an increase in the proportion of unoccupied household spaces from 1.4% to 2.4%.
- The predominant accommodation type in the ward is terraced houses or bungalows with nearly two in five households (38.3%) living in this type of accommodation, much higher than the Borough rate of 22.2%.
- Just two in five households in Malinslee (40.8%) own their home, considerably lower than the 63.7% ownership in the Borough.
- A total of 505 households (20.7%) still mistakenly believe they rent their home from the Council, a small decrease from 518 (24.4%) in 2001.
- The proportion of households in Malinslee privately renting their home has increased rapidly from 5.4% in 2001 to 14.7% in 2011, just below the 14.9% seen Borough wide.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Malinslee increased from 61.6% to 63.5%, below the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- The unemployment rate in the ward increased from 5.2% to 8.3% in the decade preceding the census, higher than the Borough rate of 4.7%.
- Some 9.3% of Malinslee residents aged 16-74 have never worked, above the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The predominant profession group in the ward is 'elementary occupations' (20.3%) higher proportionally in the ward than Borough wide (13.1%).
- Almost half (46.0%) of Household Reference Persons in Malinslee are classed as social grade DE semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers / On state benefit, unemployed, lowest grade workers, larger proportionally than Borough wide (30.8%).
- The proportion of residents in employment in the ward who travel to work by foot has increased from 11.2% in 2001 to 12.6% in 2011, higher than the 8.0% Borough wide.
- Just over a third (33.8%) of Malinslee's residents have qualifications, higher than the 24.6% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- Three quarters (75.0%) of Malinslee residents reported good or very good health, below the 80.2% Borough wide.
- Some 22.3% of the ward's residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, above the Borough wide 18.6%.
- One in nine (11.1%) of Malinslee residents provide some level of unpaid care, slightly higher than the Borough figure of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-tine, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP us the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in fulltime education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
