

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:


- The population in Shawbirch decreased by 1.3% between 2001 and 2011. It currently has a population density of 34.4, six times higher than the Borough population density of 5.7.
- In the decade prior to the 2011 Census, the 0-9 population of Shawbirch decreased by nearly a third (30.6%) from 545 to 378, putting this age group proportionally lower than the Borough (11.7% compared to 12.8%). The 10-15 age group also decreased between 2001 and 2011, however remains above the Borough figure.
- Compared to the Borough wide age profile, Shawbirch has large proportions of those aged 10-24 and 35-54.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Shawbirch remained stable between 2001 and 2011, at 6.3% of the population, considerably lower than the 10.6% across the Borough.
- Beside White British, the Asian population remained the largest in the ward at 2.2%, almost half that Borough-wide (4.2%).
- Even though the number of Christians decreased by more than 350 people, it still remained the largest religious group in the ward at 67.6%.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Just 1.5% of the ward's population had a main language other than English, less than half the Borough rate (4.1%). All of these could speak English to some extent with just 9 (0.3% of the population) unable to speak English well.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,196 occupied household spaces in Shawbirch accommodating 3,239 people, giving an average household size of 2.71, higher than the Borough rate of 2.47.
- Some 15.9% of the ward's households are single person, considerably lower than the 25.2% Borough wide.
- The largest household type in the ward is married couples with dependant children at 23.7%, considerably higher than Borough wide (16.4%).
- Just 7.2% of households in Shawbirch do not have access to a car or van, almost three times smaller than the Borough wide rate of 20.6%.
- Only 2.5% of households in Shawbirch were deprived in three or four dimensions, less than half of that seen Borough wide (5.9%).

4 Housing

Summary:

- The total number of household spaces in Shawbirch has decreased by six since 2001. The proportion of unoccupied household spaces has remained constant at 1.2%.
- More than half of households in Shawbirch (60.2%) live in a detached house or bungalow, almost twice the Borough rate of 30.8%.
- More than four out of five (81.2%) households in the ward own their own home, either outright or with a mortgage or loan considerably higher than the 63.7% ownership in the Borough.
- Some 33 households (2.8%) still mistakenly believe they rent their home from the Council, a slight increase from 31 households (2.6%) in 2001.
- The proportion of households in Shawbirch privately renting their home has doubled since 2001.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Shawbirch decreased slightly from 80.5% to 78.3%, above the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- The unemployment rate in the ward increased very slightly from 2.5% to 2.7% in the decade preceding the census and is almost half the Borough rate of 4.7%.
- Just 4.7% of Shawbirch residents aged 16-74 have never worked, below the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The predominant profession groups in the ward are 'professional occupations' (19.5%) and 'administrative and secretarial occupations' (14.4%), with both of these groups higher proportionally in the ward than Borough wide.
- More than a third (36.3%) of Household Reference Persons in Shawbirch are classed as social grade C1 supervisory, clerical, junior, managerial/administrative/professional, larger proportionally than Borough wide (28.3%).
- The number of residents in employment in the ward who travel to work via 'train, underground, metro, light rail, tram' has increased three-fold since 2001 from 10 to 31, now representing 1.7% of the wards population.
- More than a quarter (28.6%) of Shawbirch's residents have level 4 and above qualifications, higher than the 20.9% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- The large majority of Shawbirch residents (87.7%) reported good or very good health, above the 80.2% Borough wide.
- Just 11.4% of the ward's residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, a slight increase from 10.2% in 2001, but still considerably lower than the Borough wide 18.6%.
- One in ten (10.1%) of Shawbirch residents provided some level of unpaid care, similar to the Borough figure of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-tine, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP us the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
