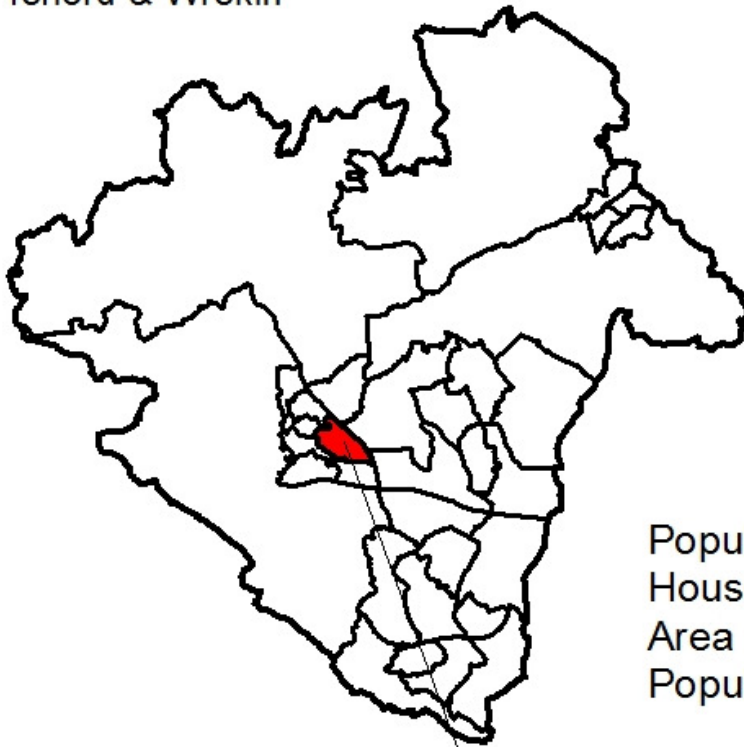
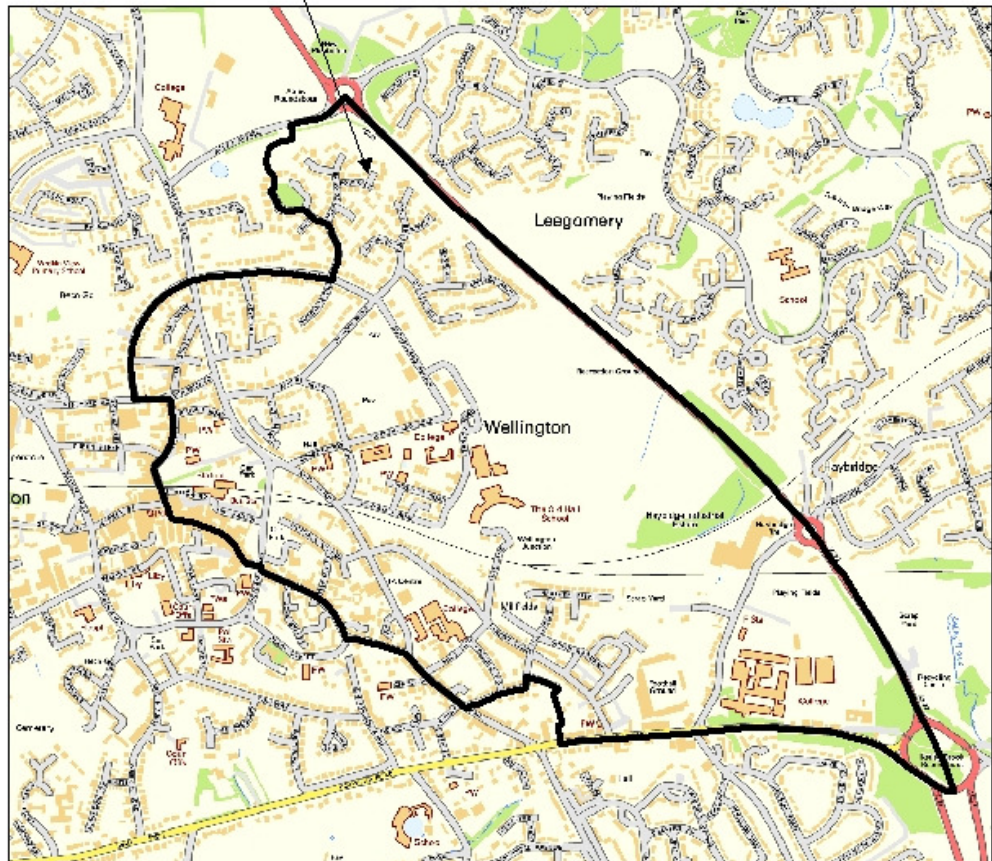

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

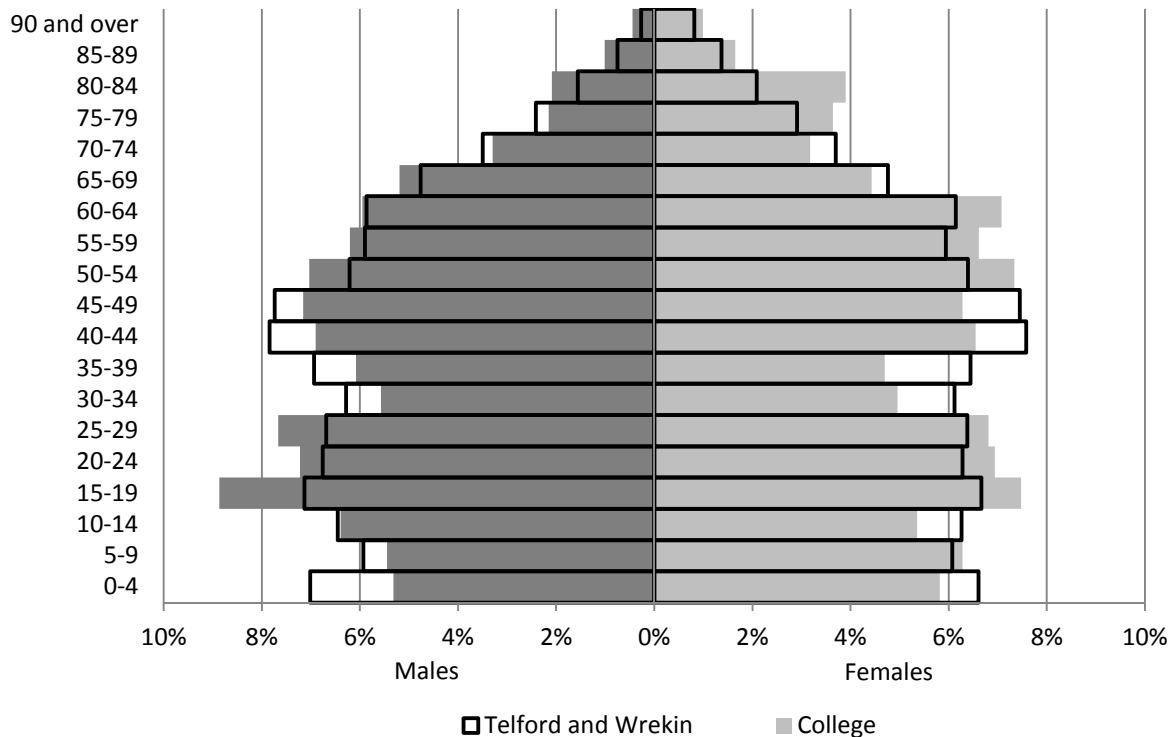
- College’s population increased very little, by just 0.8% between 2001 and 2011.
- The population aged 0-24 decreased by 22.7%, while the population aged 25 and over increased by 7% since 2001, with higher proportions than Borough wide.
- College ward has a high proportion of 15-19 year olds, possibly as a result of boarding pupils at Wrekin College.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The population of White British in the ward decreased by 8.9% between 2001 and 2011, accounting for 67.4% of the ward's total population, considerably lower than Borough-wide (89.5%).
- Nearly a third (32.6%) of College's population is from a BME community, more than three times the Borough rate, remaining the highest proportionate BME population of any ward.
- The Asian community represents a fifth (21.5%) of College's population, five times the Borough proportion for this group, making it the largest BME group in the ward.
- The proportion of Christians decreased by 14%, but it is still the largest religious group in the ward. The number of Sikhs in College has almost three times since 2001.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. A total of 15% of the ward's population have a main language other than English. The majority of these can speak English well or very well (9.0% of the population).

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,292 occupied household spaces in College accommodating 2,995 people, an average household size of 2.32, similar to the 2.36 seen Borough wide.
- At more than a third (35.6%) of total households in the ward, College has the second highest rate of one person households in the Borough.
- Nearly one in three households (31.2%) in College has no access to car or van, compared with 20.6% Borough wide.
- Even though the proportion of households deprived in at least one dimension decreased from 71.5% to 66.1%, it still above the Borough wide rate of 58.3%.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The total number of household spaces in College slightly decreased by 11 spaces since 2001.
- A fifth of households in College live in a purpose built flat, maisonette or apartment, more than double the Borough wide rate of 8.6%.
- The proportion of households who own their home in the ward decreased from 61.0% to 55.3%, while the number of households privately renting their house has doubled since 2001.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- The economically active population in College increased from 61.0% to 63.8% between 2001 and 2011, below the Borough wide rate of 69.4%.
- Unemployment rate in the ward increased from 3.9% to 6.1%, higher than Borough wide (4.7%).
- A total of 12.7% of College residents aged 16-74 have never worked, a higher rate than across the Borough (7.2%).
- At a rate of 18.7% 'professional occupations' remained the predominant occupation group in the ward, an increase from 2001 and higher than Borough wide.
- More than a third (37.4%) of household reference persons in College are classed as social grade DE - Semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers /on state benefit, unemployed, lowest grade workers, higher than the proportion in this grade Borough wide.
- Just over half (58.0%) of College residents aged 16-74 in employment travel to work driving a car, the lowest rate of any Borough ward. The proportion travelling to work by train or bus (9.3%) is higher than Borough wide (5.5%).
- The proportion of ward residents who have Level 4 and above qualifications increased from 19.8% in 2001 to 24.7% in 2011, higher than the Borough 20.9%.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- The majority of College's residents (78.6%) have very good health or good health, slightly lower than the Borough rate of 80.2%.
- Some 20.1% residents in the ward felt that their day-to-day activities were limited by a long-term health problem or disability, compared with 18.6% the Borough wide.
- The proportion of residents who provide unpaid care within College increased from 10.5% in 2001 to 11.8% in 2011, higher than the Borough wide rate of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
