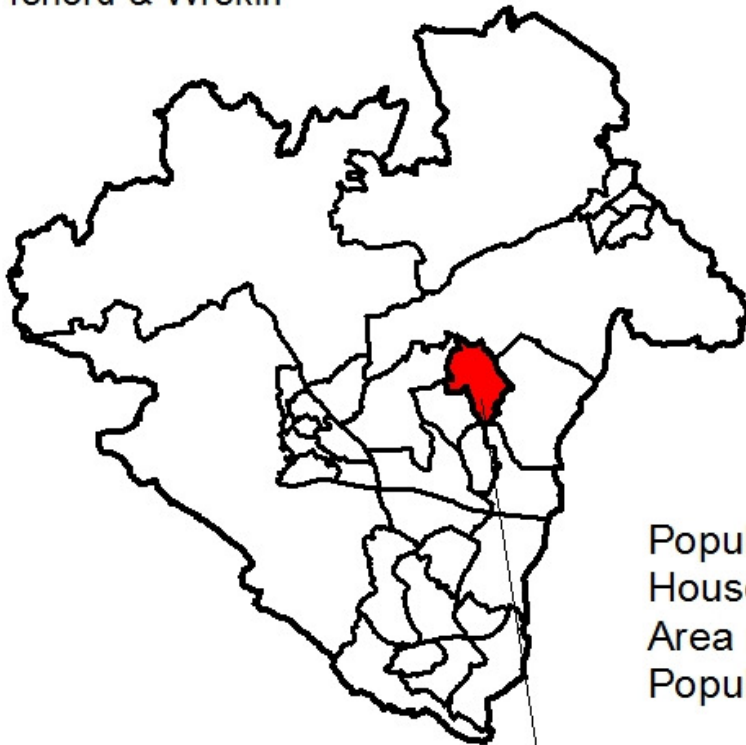
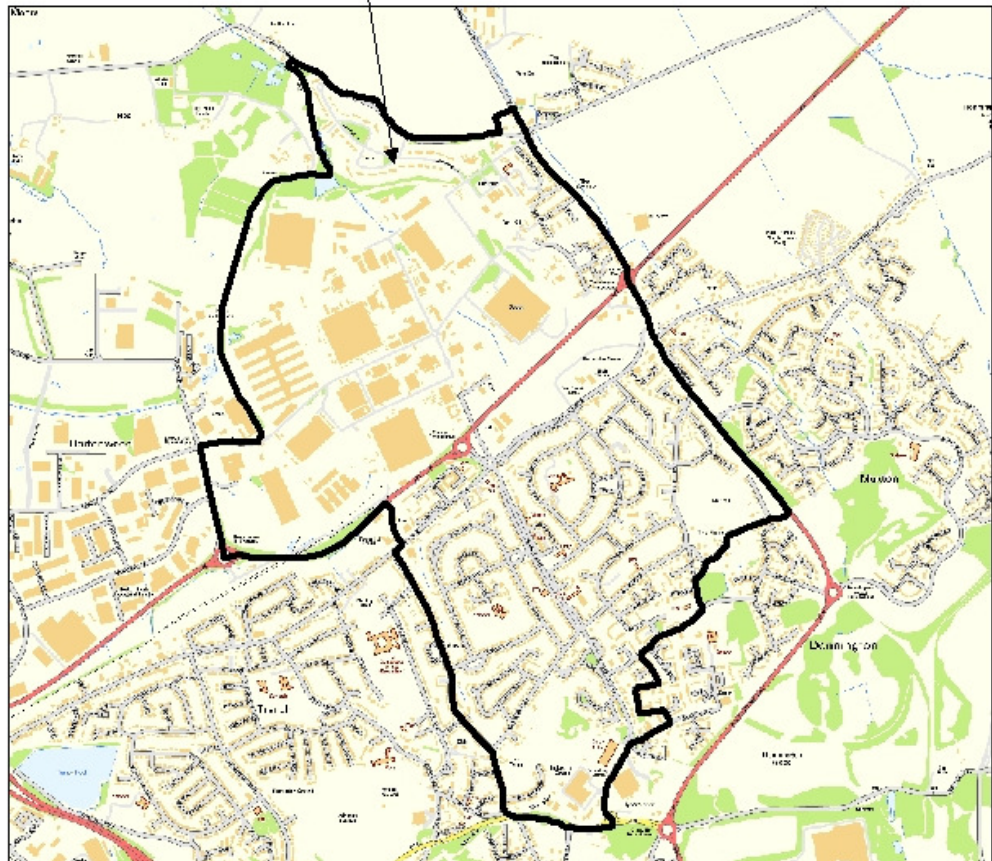

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

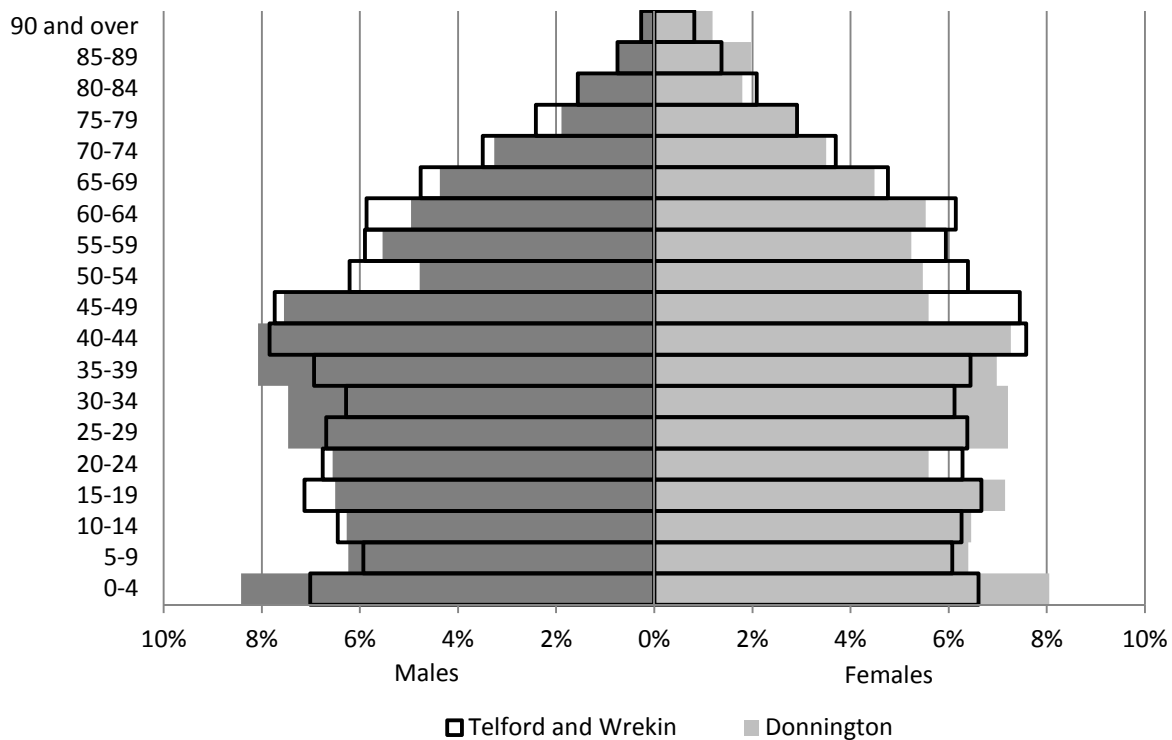
- The population of Donnington increased by 10.4% between 2001 and 2011.
- In the decade prior to the 2011 Census, the population aged 0-4 increased by 37.6%, with the 5-15 age group decreasing by 8.3%.
- Compared to the Borough wide age profile, Donnington was found to be younger; in particular, 29.9% of the ward’s population were aged 25-44 compared with 27.1% for the Borough.
- The population aged 45 and older decreased by 5.3%.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The number of the BME population in Donnington has doubled since 2001.
- Beside White British, the 'Other White' population is the largest in the ward, at a rate of 3.7%, above the Borough rate of 3.2%.
- Though the proportion of Christians decreased from 77.1% to 63.2%, it still remained the largest religious group in the ward, higher than the Borough-wide figure (61.7%).
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Out of the 3.4% of the population whose main language is not English, the majority can speak English well or very well (2.6% of the population), below the Borough-wide rate of 3.1%.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The most common household type in Donnington was one person other (not aged 65+), at 16.1%.
- Cohabiting couple households with dependent children increased from 5.1% to 8.0%, the third highest ward rate in the Borough.
- At a rate of 45.4%, the proportion of households with access to a car or van has increased by 6.9% since 2001, above the Borough wide rate of 43.1%.
- Even though the proportion of households deprived in at least one dimension decreased between 2001 and 2011, at 68.7% it is still considerably higher than the Borough (58.3%).

4 Housing

Summary:

- The number of household spaces in Donnington has increased by 270 spaces since 2001 accounting for 8.5% of the total 3,181 growth seen Borough wide.
- More than a half of the households in Donnington (52.2%) live in a semi-detached house or bungalow, more than the Borough figure of 36.7%.
- Some 50.7% of households own their home, accounting for 20.2% own completely and 30.5% own with a mortgage or loan.
- 458 (16.9%) residents in Donnington still believe they rent their home from the Council, double the Borough rate (8.1%).

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Donnington increased from 61.4% to 66.4%, but remains below the Borough rate (69.4%).
- Unemployment rate in the ward increased from 4.5 % in 2001 to 6.2% in 2011.
- A total of 7.6% of Donnington's residents aged 16-74 have never worked, above the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The largest occupation group in Donnington is 'elementary occupations' (17.8%), down from 20.9%, above the Borough rate of 13.1%.
- Some 40.7% of Household Reference Persons in Donnington are classed as social grade DE - Semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers /on state benefit, unemployed, lowest grade workers, more than double the Borough rate of 18.0%.
- The number of people in Donnington who drive a car or van to work increased from 52.8% to 65.0%, but it is still below the Borough rate of 70.0%.
- Almost a third (32.6%) of Donnington's residents aged 16+ have no qualifications, considerably higher than the 24.6% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- Some 9.1% of Donnington's residents self reported bad or very bad health, above the Borough wide rate of 6.2%.
- Nearly one quarter of residents (23.6%) felt they day-to-day activities were limited due to a long-term health illness or disability, a higher proportion than Borough wide (18.6%).
- Some 11.3% of residents provide unpaid care, slightly above the 10.8% Borough wide.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
