

**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 BOROUGH OF TELFORD AND WREKIN NOTICE OF SPEED LIMIT PROPOSAL  
 TELFORD AND WREKIN COUNCIL WELLINGTON ROAD (NEWPORT) (RESTRICTED ROADS 30MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER  
 2019**

Notice is hereby given that Borough of Telford & Wrekin proposes to make the above named Order under Sections 82, 83 and 84 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

The effect of the Order will be the 40mph (The Borough of Telford and Wrekin Council (Wellington Road, Newport) (40mph Speed Limit) Order 1999) shall cease to have effect insofar as stated in Schedule One below and introduce a speed limit of 30mph along the length specified in Schedule Two below.

Telford and Wrekin Council (Wellington Road, Newport) (40mph Speed Limit) Order 1999	WELLINGTON ROAD	From a point 96 metres south of the southern end of its junction with Dark Lane in a south westerly direction to a point 50 metres south west of its junction with Greenvale.

1.	WELLINGTON ROAD	From a point 96 metres south of the southern end of its junction with Dark Lane in a south westerly direction to a point 50 metres south west of its junction with Greenvale.
