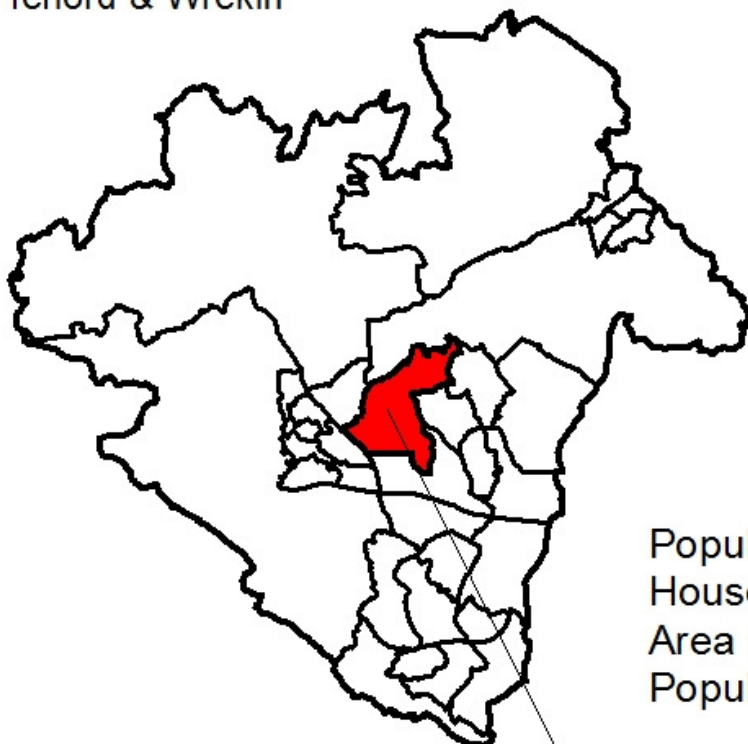
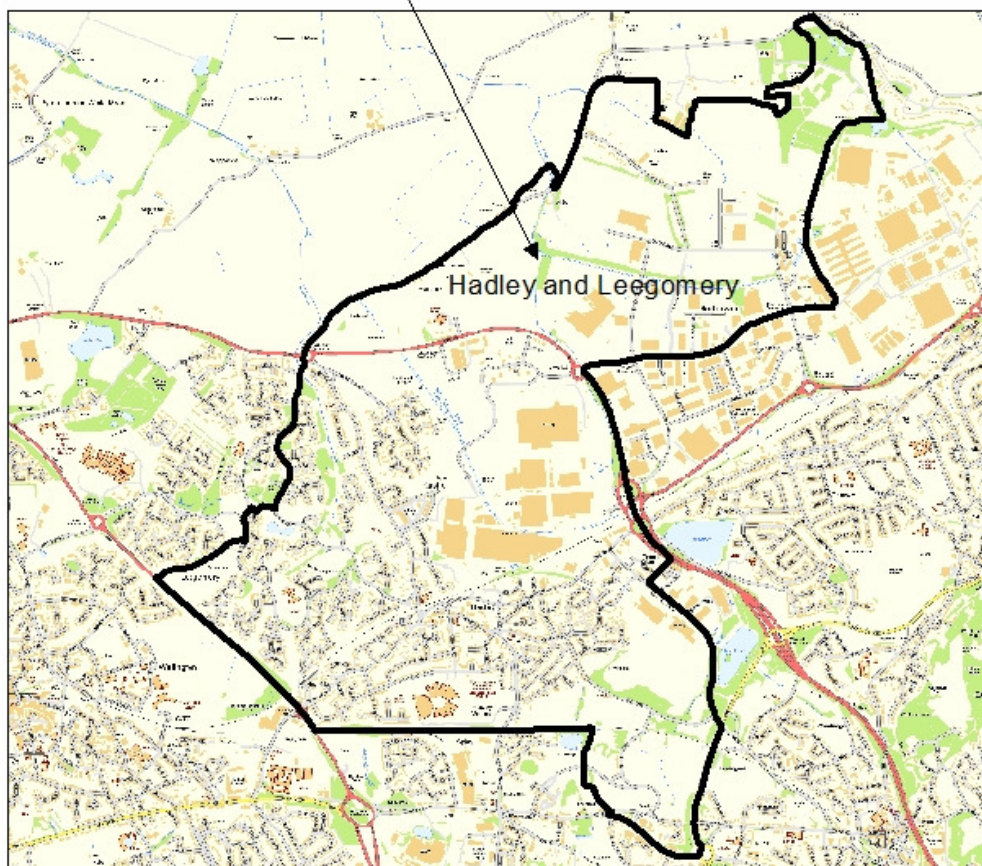

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

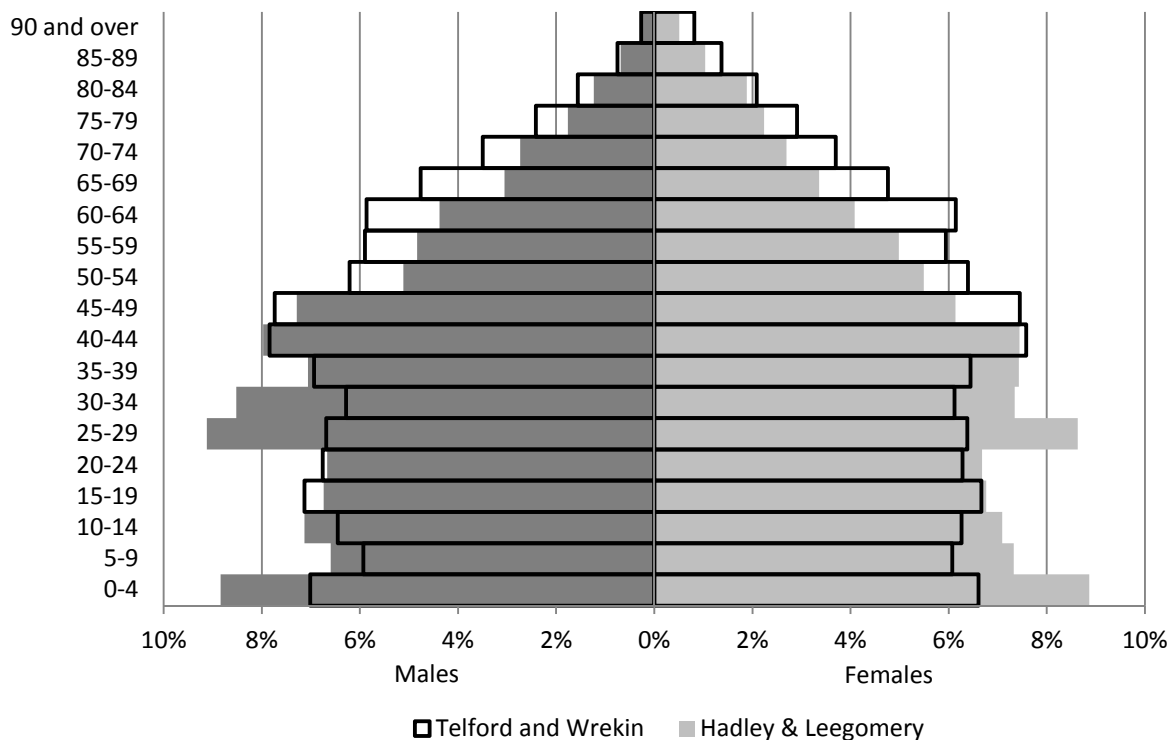
- Population in Hadley & Leegomery increased by 14.3% between 2001 and 2011, with a population density of 16.0, nearly triple the Borough wide density of 5.7.
- In the decade prior to the 2011 Census, the population in Hadley and Leegomery aged 0-15 increased by 8.5% and at rates 8.9%, 7.0% and 8.6% for the 0-4, 5-9, 10-15 cohorts, respectively, is younger than the Borough (6.8% for the age group 0-4, 6.0% for the 5-9 cohort and 7.7% for the age group 10-15). The population aged 25-44 increased by 15.0% and at a rate of 31.7% is above the Borough rate of 27.1%
- The proportion of residents aged 45 and over has decreased by 13.6% since 2001 with lower proportions than the Borough.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population in Hadley & Leegomery nearly doubled, increasing from 15.6% in 2001 to 26.8% in 2011 and is now more than twice the Borough wide rate of 10.6%.
- The Asian population remained the largest BME group in the ward at 11.7%. The second largest BME group in the ward, 'Other White', grew rapidly since 2001, an increase of more than 800 people.
- The proportion of Christians decreased between 2001 and 2011 and at 57.4%, is below the Borough rate of 61.7%.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Out of 12.9% of the ward population whose main language is not English, the majority can speak English well or very well (8.7% of the population), above the Borough (3.1%).

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The proportion of one person households has decreased by 1.1% since 2001 and at a total of 24.5% is similar to the Borough rates.
- The proportion of cohabiting couple households and lone parent households has increased since 2001, with proportions higher than the Borough. Particularly, cohabiting couple households with no children increased by 61.4%, with dependent children increased by 58.6%, all children non-dependent increased by 76.5%.
- Even though the number of households without any access to car or van decreased from 26.9% to 23.4%, it is still above the Borough rate of 20.6%.
- Some 62.6% of households in the ward were deprived in at least one dimension, a decrease from 73.4% in 2001, but still above the 58.3% Borough-wide.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The total number of household spaces in Hadley & Leegomery has increased by 414 spaces since 2001 with an increase in the proportion of unoccupied household spaces from 2.2% to 2.9%.
- The predominant accommodation type in the ward is semi-detached houses or bungalows at 42.2%, above the Borough wide rate of 36.7%.
- The proportion of households that own their home outright increased by 17.4%, while the rate of households that own their home with a mortgage or loan decreased by 7.5%. Both rates are now below the Borough.
- Some 16.5% of households rent their home from private landlord or letting agency, nearly triple that since 2001, and above the Borough rate of 13.6%.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- The proportion of economically active population in the ward increased from 65.4% to 70.3% above the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- Unemployment rate in Hadley and Leegomery increased from 3.7% to 5.0% between 2001 and 2011, above the Borough (4.7%).
- Some 9.1% of residents aged 16-74 have never worked, compared with the 7.2% Borough wide.
- 'Process, plant and machine operatives' and 'Elementary occupations' are the predominant occupation groups in Hadley and Leegomery, at similar rates 16.0% and 16.1%, respectively.
- More than a third of Household Reference Persons in Hadley & Leegomery (37.5%) are classed as social grade DE - Semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers /on state benefit, unemployed, lowest grade workers, above the Borough wide rate of 30.8%.
- Some 66.2% of residents aged 16-74 drive a car or van to work, an increase from 61.4%, but still below the Borough (70.0%).
- Some 26.8% of Hadley & Leegomery residents aged 16+ have no qualifications, higher than the 24.6% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- Some 79.6% of residents in the ward self reported good or very good health (32.6% good health and 47.0% very good health), just below the 80.2% Borough wide.
- A total of 18.6% of ward residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited due to a long-term health problem or disability, the same proportion as Borough wide.
- The proportion of residents who provide unpaid care hasn't changed since 2001 and at 10.5% is slightly below the Borough wide figure (10.8%).

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
