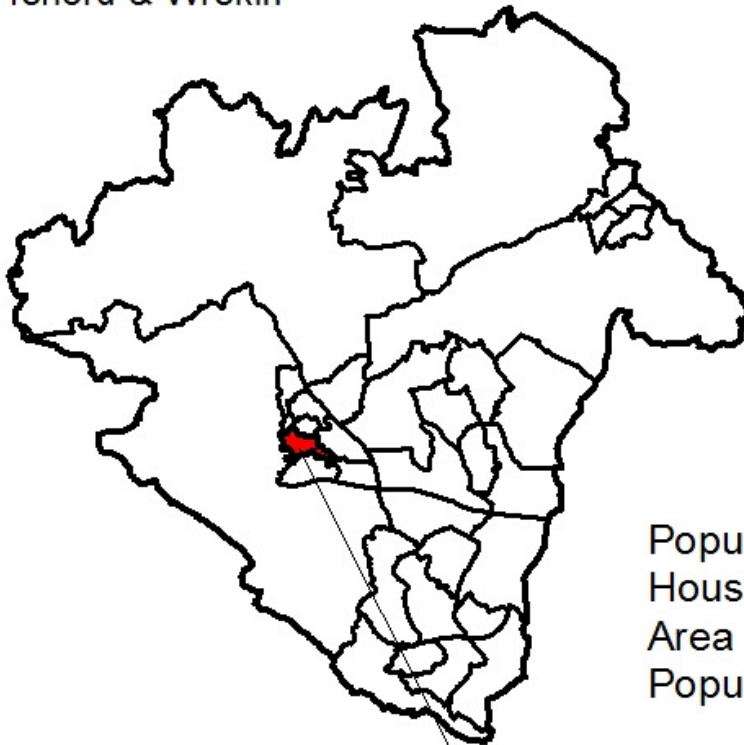
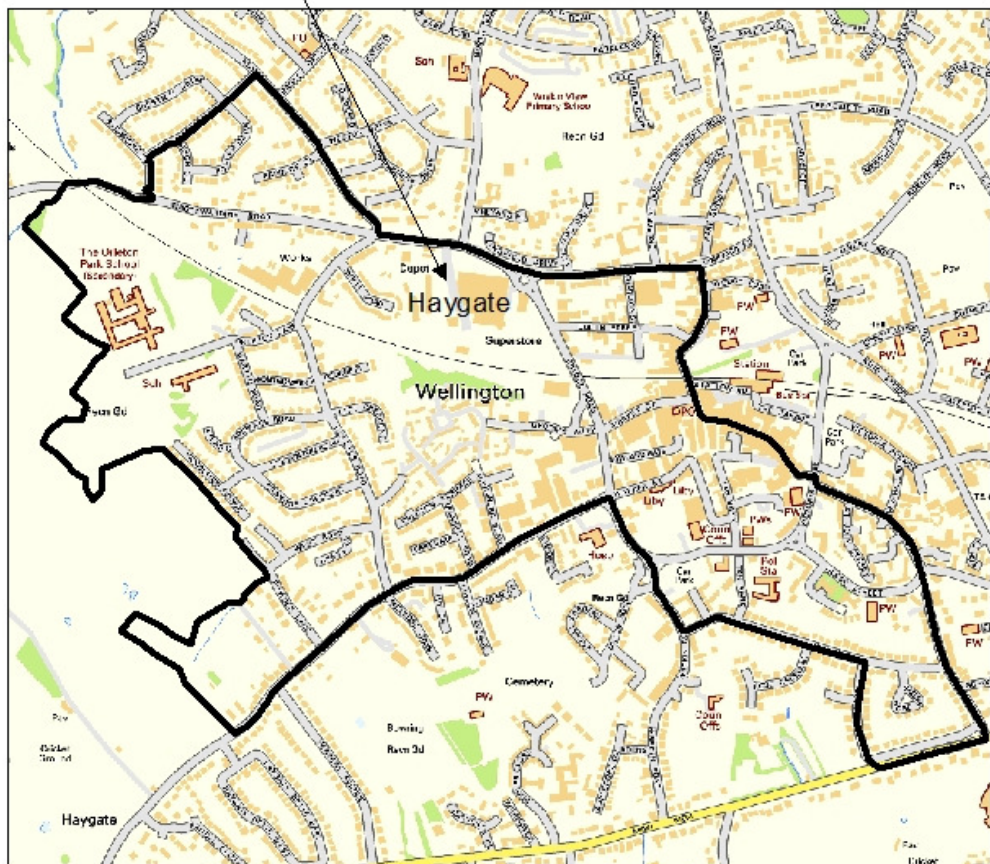

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

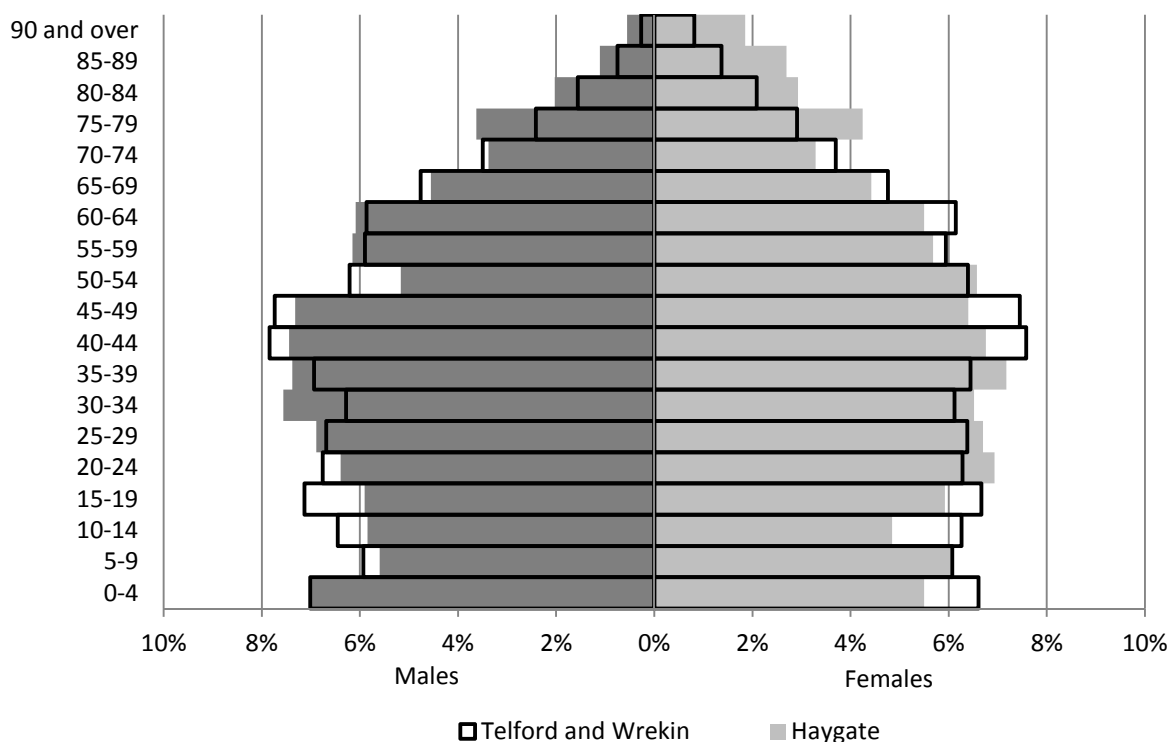
- Population in Haygate increased by 24.4% between 2001 and 2011.
- In the ten years prior to the 2011 Census, the population aged 0-44 increased, in particular, the age group 0-15 increased by 30.8%, the 16-24 cohort increased by 38.3% and the age group 25-44 increased by 32.7%.
- A decrease of the 45-84 age groups was seen between the 2001 and 2011 Census; 45-64 decreased from 25.3% to 24.4% and 65-84 decreased from 18.0% to 14.3%. The population aged 85+ increased by 66.1%, and now at 3.1% of the population is above the Borough rate of 1.6%.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Haygate has tripled since 2001, accounting for 13.7% of the ward's population, higher than Borough-wide (10.6%).
- The Asian population has more than tripled and at 5.5%, higher than the Borough figure, is now the largest BME group in the ward.
- The proportion of Christians decreased by 1.6% and at a rate of 58.0% is below the 61.7% Borough wide.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Out of the 5.7% of the population whose main language is not English, the majority can speak English well or very well (4.5% of the population), above the Borough-wide rate of 3.1%.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,530 occupied household spaces in Haygate accommodating 3,273 people on area big 94.78 hectares, giving a population density 34.8.
- More than a third (36.6%) of households in Haygate are one person households, higher than the Borough wide rate of 25.2%.
- One third (33.7%) of households has no access to a car or van, decrease from 39.4% in 2001, higher than the Borough rate of 20.6%.
- Some 65.5% of households in Haygate are deprived in at least one dimension, compared with the 58.3% Borough-wide.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The number of household spaces in Haygate has increased by 277 since 2001 accounting for 8.7% of the 3,181 growth seen Borough wide.
- A third of households in the ward (33.7%) live in a semi-detached house or bungalow, below the Borough wide rate of 36.7%. The proportion of households living in a purpose built flat, maisonette or apartment increased from 20.2% to 23.2%, far above the 8.6% Borough wide.
- The proportion of households that own their home outright increased from 20.5% to 22.6%, with a decrease of households that own their home with a mortgage or loan.
- Some 14.2% of households in Haygate mistakenly believe they rent their home from the Council with some 19.0% renting from another social landlord, both proportions are higher than the Borough (8.1% and 11.6%, respectively).

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Haygate increased from 62.4% to 69.1%, just below the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- Unemployment rate in the ward has increased by from 4.2% to 5.8% since 2001, above the 4.7% Borough wide.
- Some 7.2% of Haygate residents aged 16-74 have never worked, same rate as the Borough.
- The predominant occupation type in the ward (15.8%) is 'professional occupations', with a greater proportion than Borough wide (13.9%).
- More than a third of Household Reference Persons in Haygate (35.5%) are classed as social grade DE- Semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers /on state benefit, unemployed, lowest grade workers, above the Borough rate of 30.8%.
- The proportion of Haygate's residents aged 16-74 travelling to work by train, underground, metro, light rail, tram, increased from 4.2% to 5.2%, more than triple the Borough rate of 1.5%.
- Some 29.2% of Haygate's population have no qualifications, above the 24.6% Borough.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- Nearly three quarters of residents in Haygate (74.3%) self reported good or very good health, compared with the 80.2% Borough wide.
- A quarter of residents (24.9%) in the ward felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, higher than the 18.6% seen across the Borough.
- Some 11.9% of people in Haygate provide unpaid care, above the Borough rate of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
