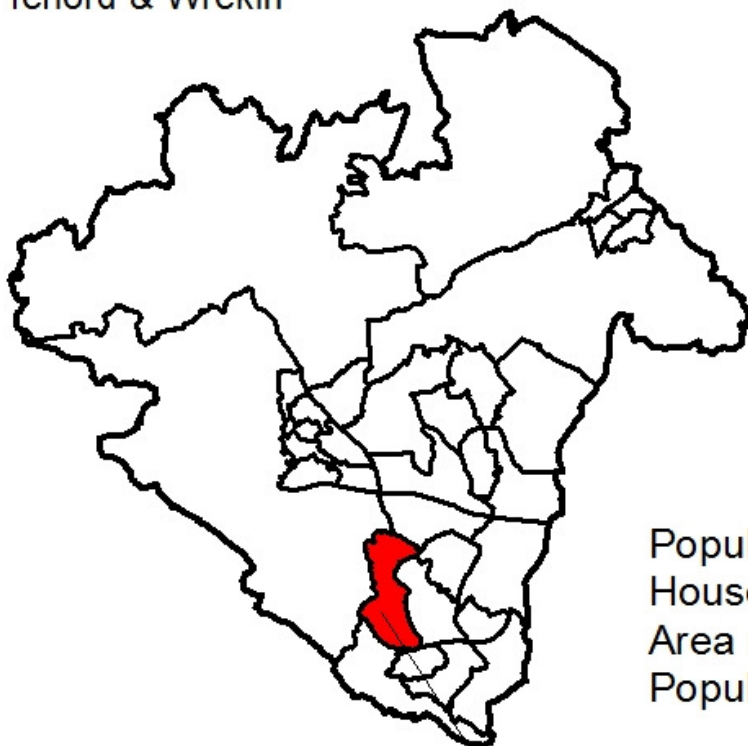
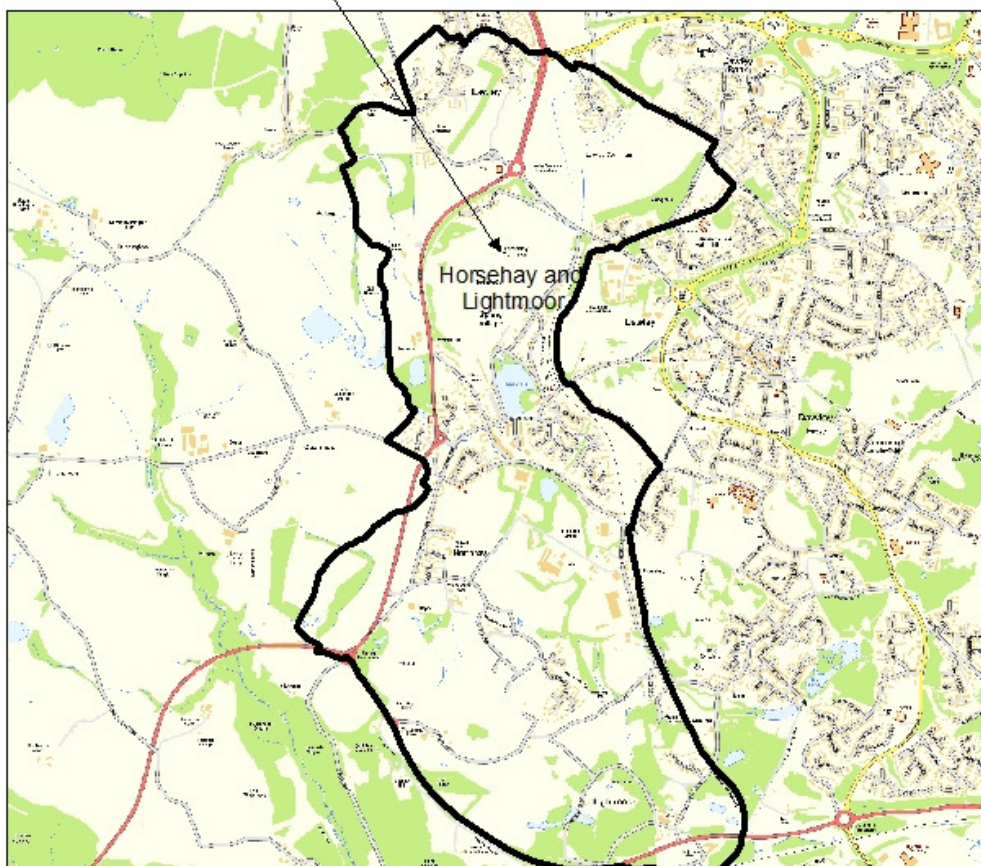

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

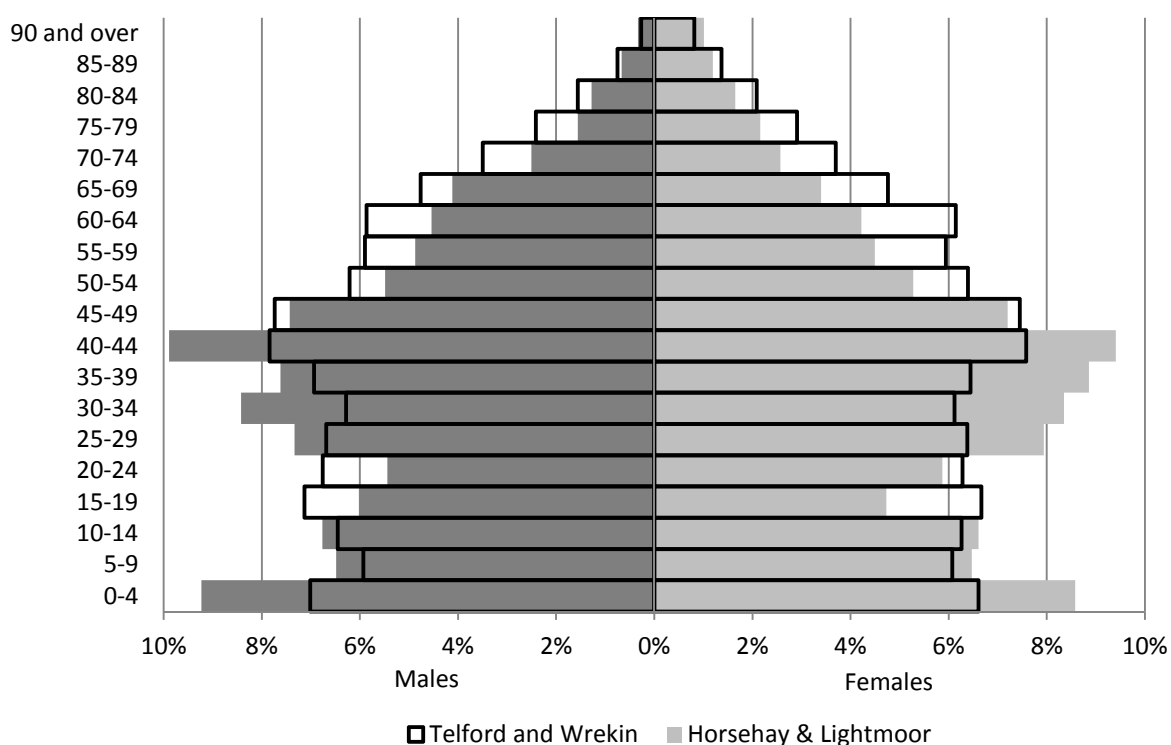
- Horsehay & Lightmoor’s population increased by 52.5% between 2001 and 2011, an increase of nearly 1,500 people. The ward covers an area of 451.2 hectares, giving a population density of 9.5, above the 5.7 seen Borough wide.
- The population in the ward is younger than the Borough, particularly 23.3% of total population is aged 0-15 (20.5% in the Borough), 33.9% of the population is aged 25-44, compared with 27.1% Borough wide.
- The proportion of the 45-64 age group remained fairly stable between 2001 and 2011, with those aged 65+ increasing by 95.1%.
- Horsehay & Lightmoor’s population is dominated by the 0-4 and 40-44 age groups, with higher proportions than Borough wide.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Horsehay & Lightmoor increased from 5.1% to 6.3% between 2001 and 2011, lower than Borough wide (10.6%).
- At a rate of 2.4%, the 'Other White' population remains the largest in the ward, below the Borough wide rate of 3.2%.
- The proportion of Christians in the ward decreased from 75.3% to 62.1%, but remains above the Borough (61.7%).
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Out of the 1.9% of the population whose main language is not English, the majority can speak English well or very well (1.4% of the population), below the Borough-wide rate of 3.1%.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,559 occupied household spaces in Horsehay & Lightmoor accommodating 4,172 people giving an average household size of 2.68, slightly higher than the average size of 2.47 Borough wide.
- The proportion of cohabiting households increased by 58.7%, particularly, those with no children increased by 59.4%, and those with dependent children by 46.1%.
- Just 7.3% of households in Horsehay & Lightmoor have no access to a car or van far lower than the 20.6% of households Borough wide in this position.
- The rate of households deprived in at least one dimension declined from 55.3% to 41.2%, lower than the Borough rate of 58.3%.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The number of household spaces in Horsehay & Lightmoor has increased by 532 since 2001 accounting for 16.7% of the 3,181 growth seen Borough wide.
- Two out of five households (41.0%) live in a detached house or bungalow, a slight decrease from 2001, but still above the Borough rate of 30.8%.
- More than a half of all households in the ward (50.4%) own their home with a mortgage or loan, above the Borough (36.5%).
- The number of households who rent their home from a social landlord has doubled since 2001 and the number of households privately renting has tripled.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- The proportion of economically active population changed very little from 78.4% in 2001 to 78.1%, in 2011 higher than the 69.4% Borough wide.
- The unemployment rate in Horsehay & Lightmoor increased from 2.1% to 2.6%, nearly half the Borough figure (4.7%).
- Between 2001 and 2011 the proportion of residents who have never worked increased from 2.3% to 4.9%, lower than the Borough (7.2%).
- Nearly a fifth of residents (19.1%) aged 16-74 are employed in 'professional occupations' compared to 13.9% seen Borough wide.
- Some 35.0% of Household Reference Persons are classed as social grade C1- Supervisory, clerical, junior managerial/administrative/professional higher than the 28.3% Borough wide.
- The proportion of residents aged 16-74 driving a car or van to work has increased from 74.8% to 78.8% since 2001, above the Borough (70.0%).
- Some 29.9% of residents aged 16 and over have level 4 and above qualifications, above the 20.9% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- Some 84.8% of Horsehay & Lightmoor residents self reported good or very good health, compared to the 80.2% Borough wide.
- Some 14.5% of residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited due to a long-term health problem or disability, lower than the 18.6% Borough wide.
- The proportion of people providing unpaid care in the ward slightly increased from 9.1% to 9.6%, below the Borough (10.8%).

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
