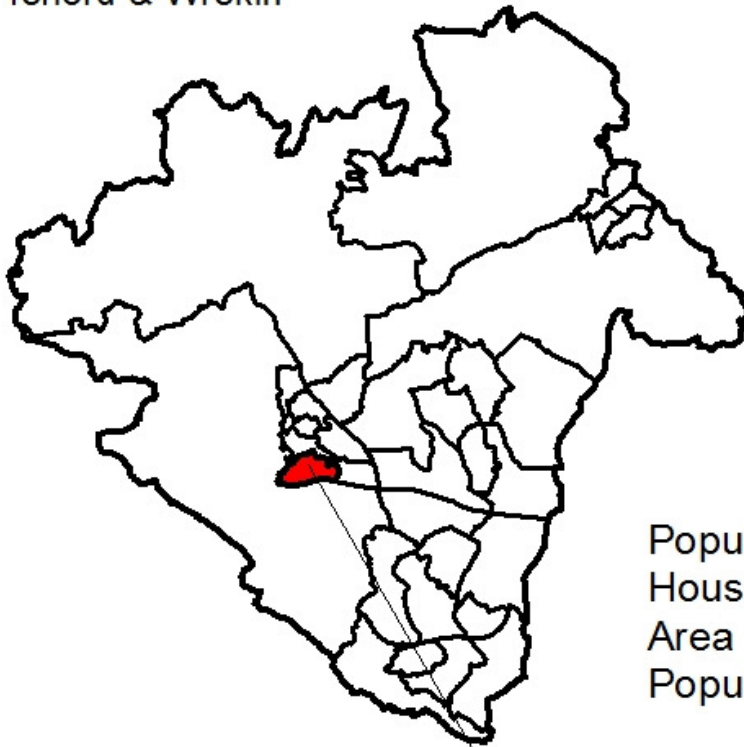
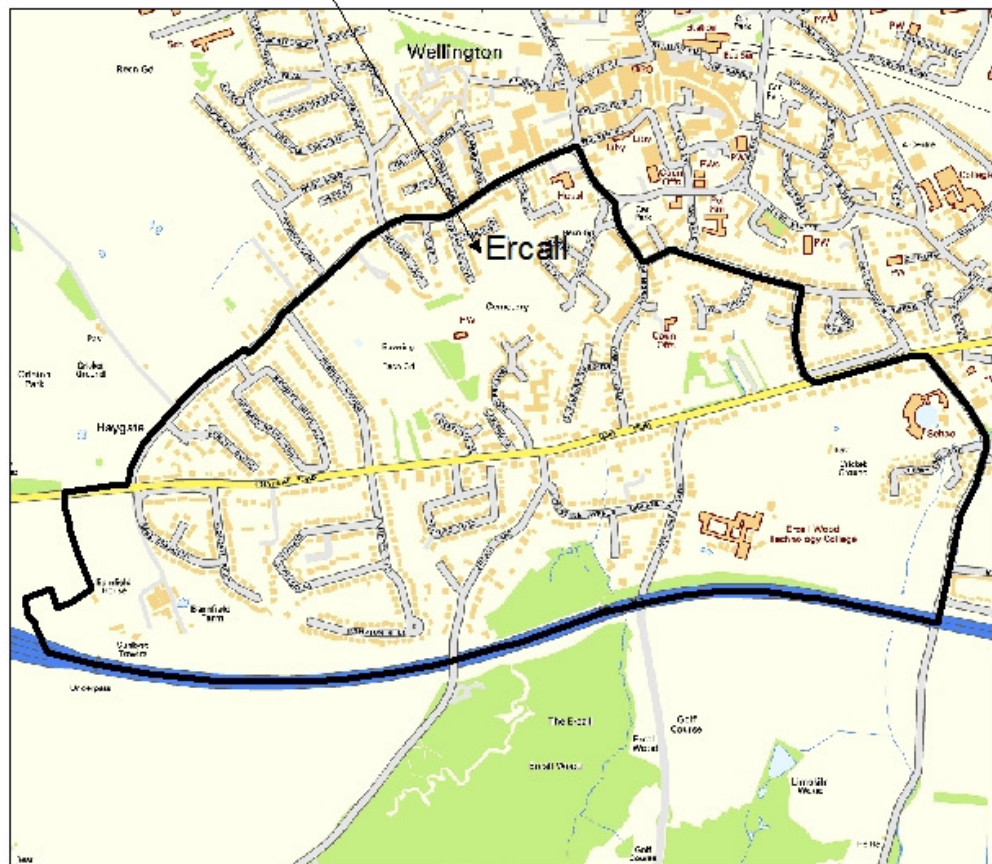

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

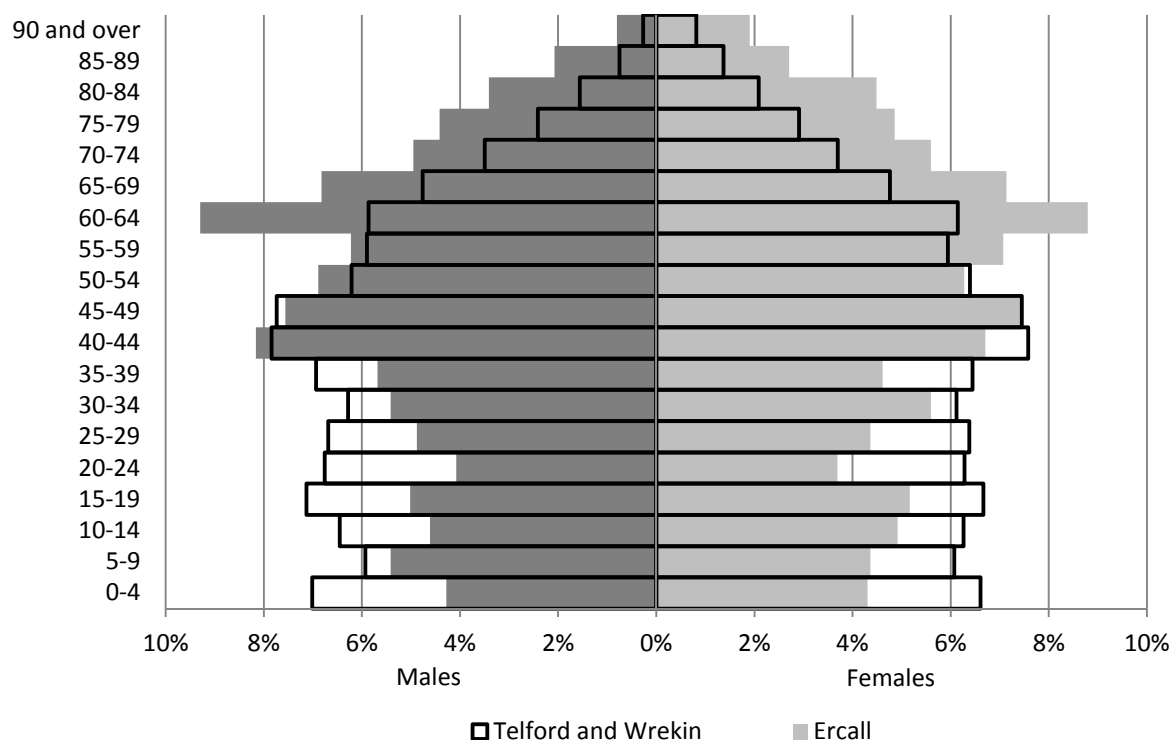
- Ercall's population increased by 10.1% between 2001 and 2011.
- In the ten years prior to the 2011 Census, the 0-24 age group increased by 13.5%, with those aged 25-44 increased by 8.9%.
- The population aged 45 and over increased by 9.2% in total; 45-64 by 6.8%, 65-84 by 7.4% and the greatest growth seen in the 85+ cohort, 49.4%.
- Ercall's population is dominated by the 60-64 age group, with higher proportions than Borough wide.
- The ward's population is considerably older than the Borough wide picture with lower proportions of all ages under 35 and considerably higher proportions of those aged 60+.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Ercall grew by 84.5% between 2001 and 2011, accounting for 8.7% of the ward's total population, lower than Borough-wide (10.6%).
- The Asian community increased by three quarters and at 3.8% remains the largest BME group in the ward.
- The proportion of Christians decreased from 80.9% to 68.9%, above the Borough rate of 61.7%. Numbers of Muslims and Sikhs in the ward increased.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Out of the 2.8% of the population whose main language is not English, the majority can speak English well or very well (2.5% of the population), below the Borough-wide rate of 3.1%.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,363 occupied household spaces in Ercall accommodating 3,030 people, an average household size of 2.22.
- The number of one person households increased by 6.1% between 2001 and 2011 and at 29.2%, remains above the Borough figure (25.2%).
- Even though the proportion of 'one family and no others aged 65+' households decreased between 2001 and 2011, at 13.4% it is the second highest ward rate in the Borough and far above the Borough rate of 7.6%
- The proportion of households without access to a car or van decreased by 0.9% and at 15.9% is below the Borough rate of 20.6%. Ercall ward has proportionally more households with access to at least 1 car or van than the Borough.
- The proportion of households deprived in at least one dimension has decreased by half since 2001 and at 51.1% is below the Borough rate of 58.3%.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The number of household spaces in Ercall has increased by 126 since 2001 accounting for just 1.4% of the 3,181 growth seen Borough wide.
- More than two in five households in Ercall (41.7%) live in a semi-detached house or bungalow, compared to the Borough rate of 36.7%.
- Some 45.2% of households in Ercall own their home completely, compared to the 27.2% Borough wide.
- More than a third of households in Ercall (36.5%) own their home with a mortgage or loan, same rate as the Borough.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Ercall increased slightly from 65.0% to 66.5%, but remains below the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- Unemployment rate in the ward increased from 2.4% in 2001 to 3.0% in 2011.
- A total of 5.4% of Ercall residents aged 16-74 have never worked, below the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The predominant occupation group in Ercall is 'Professional Occupations' at a rate of 22.6%, above the Borough rate of 13.9%.
- Nearly one third of all household reference persons aged 16-64 (30.5%) are classed as social grade AB - Higher and intermediate managerial/administrative/professional.
- As the number of households with access to a car or van increased, the number of residents aged 16-74 driving a car or van to work also increased. The proportion of residents in employment driving a car or van increased to 73.7% is higher than the 70.0% Borough wide.
- Nearly a third (31.6%) of residents aged 16+ have level 4 and above qualifications, considerably higher than the 20.9% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- The general health profile in Ercall was similar to the Borough. Some 43.9% in the ward self reported very good health, 34.6% of residents reported good health, compared with 45.9% and 34.3% the Borough wide, respectively.
- The total of 21.1% of residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited due to a long-term health problem or disability, compared to the 18.6% Borough wide.
- The proportion of Ercall's residents providing unpaid care decreased slightly to 12.5%, but it is still above the Borough wide rate of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
