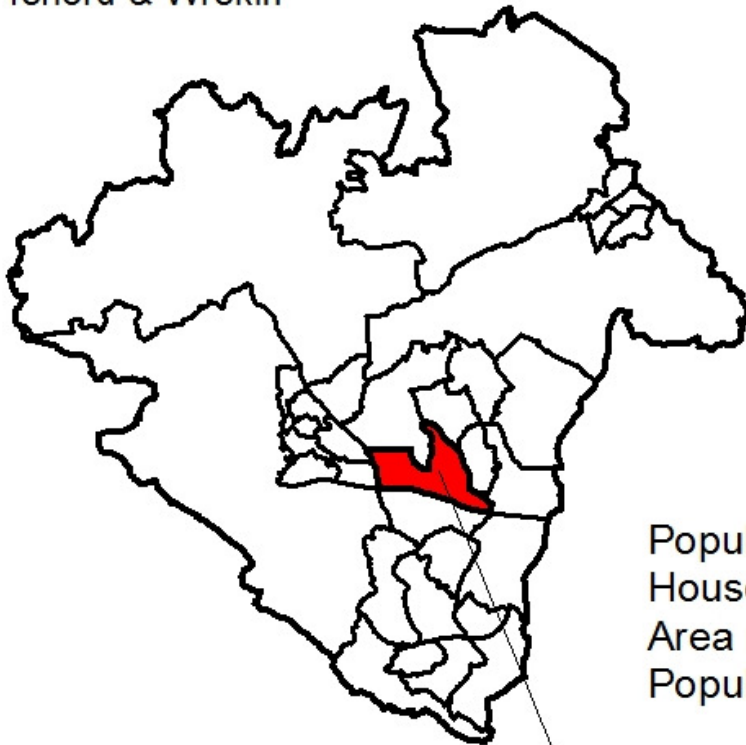
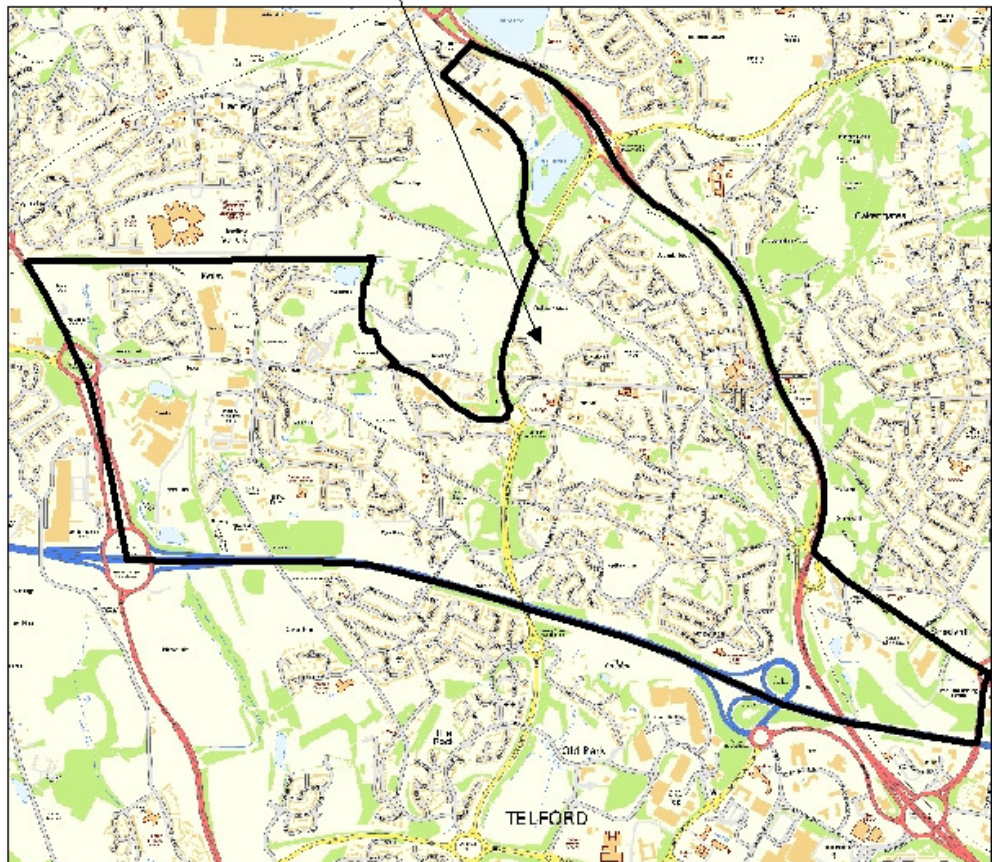

1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

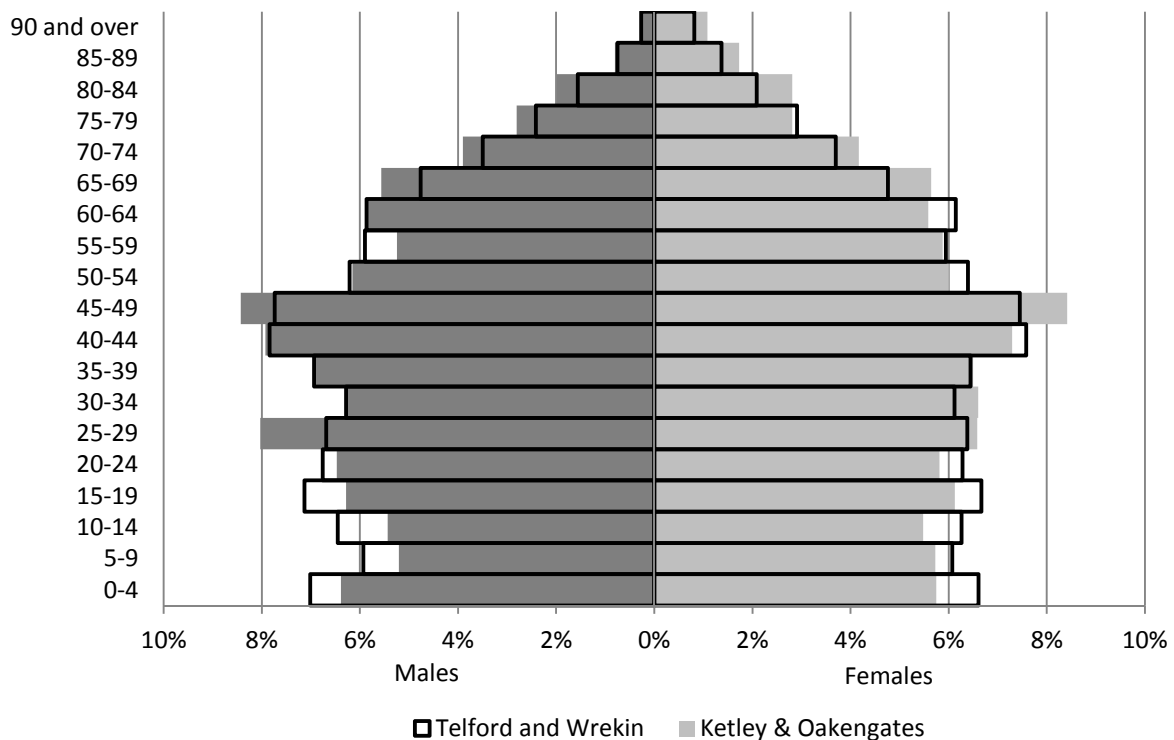
- Ketley and Oakengates' population increased by 5.5% between 2001 and 2011.
- In the ten years prior to the 2011 Census, the 0-15 age group decreased by 4.7%, with those aged 16-24 increasing by 23.0%.
- The 25-44 cohort decreased by 5.5%, with the population aged 45 and over increasing; 45-64 by 10.2% and 65+ by 24.4%.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Ketley and Oakengates grew by 78.0% between 2001 and 2011, accounting for 7.4% of the ward's total population, lower than Borough-wide (10.6%).
- The Other White population has more than doubled but at 2.9% is still lower than the Borough rate of 3.2%.
- Although the proportion of Christians decreased from 76.9% to 64.8%, higher than the 61.7% Borough wide, is still remained the largest religious group in the ward.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Out of the 3.1% of the population whose main language is not English, the majority can speak English well or very well (2.2% of the population), below the Borough-wide rate of 3.1%.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 4,063 occupied household spaces in Ketley and Oakengates accommodating 9,475 people, an average household size of 2.33.
- One person households decreased by 3.5%, accounting for a total 27.7% of the wards households, higher than the 25.2% Borough wide.
- One family households aged 65 and over increased from 6.9% to 8.2% between 2001 and 2011, compared with 7.6% Borough wide.
- The proportion of households without access to a car or van decreased by 4.5%, and at 22.2% of households in the ward is higher than the Borough figure (20.6%).
- Some 62.4% of households were deprived in at least one dimension, compared to 58.3% Borough wide.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The number of household spaces in Ketley and Oakengates has increased by 203 since 2001 accounting for 6.4% of the 3,181 growth seen Borough wide.
- More than one half of total households (55.4%) in Ketley and Oakengates live in semi-detached houses or bungalows, considerably higher than the 36.7% Borough wide.
- A quarter of total households in the ward (25.7%) own their home outright, below the 27.2% Borough wide.
- The number of households renting their home from a private landlord or letting agency has more than tripled between 2001 and 2011.
- Some 10.4% of households in the ward mistakenly believe they rent their home from the Council.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Ketley & Oakengates increased slightly from 68.5% to 69.6%, just above the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- Unemployment rate in the ward increased by half, and at 4.6% is similar to the Borough rate of 4.7%.
- A total of 6.6% of Ketley and Oakengates' residents aged 16-74 have never worked, slightly below the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The proportion of people employed in 'skilled trade occupations' in Ketley and Oakengates (14.2%), is above the Borough wide figure (11.9%). Some 14.1% residents aged 16-74 are employed in 'elementary occupations', a decrease from 15.9% in 2001.
- Almost a third of Household Reference Persons in Ketley and Oakengates (32.5%) are classed as social grade DE - semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers / on state benefit, unemployed, lowest grade workers, above the Borough rate of 30.8%.
- The proportion of people in Ketley and Oakengates who drive a car or van to work increased from 64.8% to 71.0%, just above the Borough rate of 70.0%.
- The proportion of people aged 16 and over with no qualifications in Ketley & Oakengates (29.2%), is above the Borough figure (24.6%).

6 Health and care

Summary:

- Some 76.9% of residents in Ketley & Oakengates self reported good or very good health, compared to 80.2% Borough wide.
- A total of 21.9% of Ketley & Oakengates residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, a small increase from 21.2% in 2001, and higher than the 18.6% seen across the Borough.
- Some 12.1% of residents in the ward provided unpaid care, higher than the 10.8% seen Borough wide.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
