

Newport East – 2011 Census Profile

1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

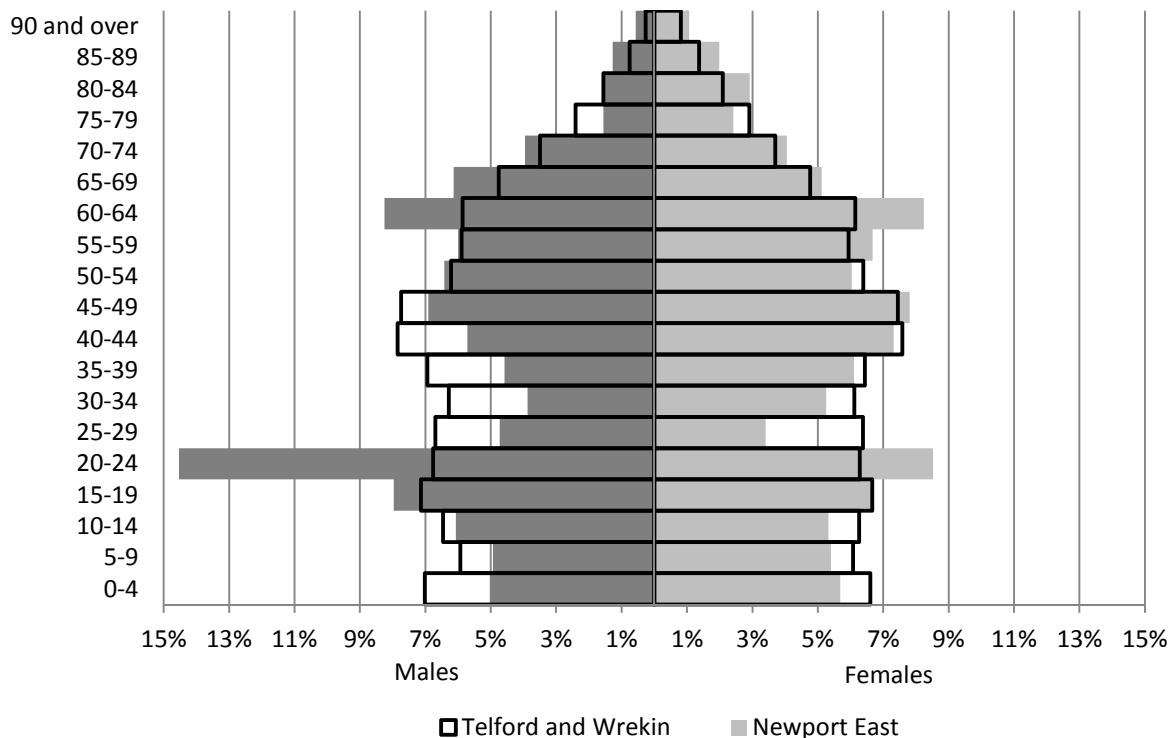
- Population in Newport East increased by just 2.2% between 2001 and 2011, with population density of 36.6, more than six times higher than the Borough wide population density of 5.7.
- In the decade prior to the 2011 Census, the 65+ population increased from 13.0% to 16.3%.
- Newport East's population is dominated by the 20-24 age group, particularly males, due to the ward's proximity to Harper Adams University.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Newport East increased by 8.8% from a small base between 2001 and 2011, representing just 3.5% of the population, a third of the 10.6% seen across the Borough.
- Beside White British, the 'Other White' population remained the largest at 1.6%, having fallen from 2.2% in 2001 and still lower than Borough-wide (4.2%).
- The proportion of Christians in the ward decreased from 82.1% to 69.5.0% between 2001 and 2011, but remained the largest religious group in the ward, above the Borough proportion of 61.7%.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Just 1.6% of Newport East residents have a main language other than English, lower than the 4.1% seen Borough wide.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,109 occupied household spaces in Newport East accommodating 2,826 people, an average household size of 2.55, slightly higher than the 2.47 Borough wide.
- Since 2001, the proportion of one person households has remained stable at 23.0%, below the Borough rate of 25.2%
- The largest household type in the ward is married couple households with dependent children at a rate of 18.2%, higher than the Borough wide 16.4%.
- Some 15.4% of households in Newport East have no access to a car or van, lower than the Borough wide figure (20.6%). The proportion of households with access to four or more cars or vans (4.4%) is double that Borough wide (2.1%).
- Just under half (46.9%) of households in the ward are not deprived in any dimension, a large increase from 35.1% in 2001 and above the Borough figure of 41.7%

4 Housing

Summary:

- The total number of household spaces in Newport East has increased by 34 since 2001 with the proportion of unoccupied household spaces increasing from 0.3% to 1.2%.
- The predominant accommodation type in the ward is detached houses or bungalows with almost half of all households (47.7%) living in this type of accommodation, much higher than the Borough rate of 30.8%.
- Nearly three quarters (72.5%) of households in Newport East own their home, considerably higher than the 63.7% ownership in the Borough.
- A total of 67 households (6.0%) still mistakenly believe they rent their home from the Council, an increase from 58 (5.3%) in 2001.
- The proportion of households in Newport North privately renting their home has increased from 4.6% in 2001 to 12.8% in 2011, lower than the 14.9% Borough wide.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Newport East decreased from 70.4% to 64.6%, below the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- The unemployment rate in the ward increased slightly from 2.4% to 3.0% in the decade preceding the census but is still below the Borough rate of 4.7%.
- Some 6.3% of Newport North residents aged 16-74 have never worked, slightly below the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The predominant profession group in the ward is 'professional occupations' (17.2%) higher proportionally in the ward than Borough wide (13.9%).
- More than a third (35.5%) of Household Reference Persons in Newport East are classed as social grade C1 – supervisory, clerical, junior, managerial/administrative/professional, larger proportionally than Borough wide (28.3%).
- The proportion of residents in employment in the ward who travel to work driving a car or van has increased from 66.4% in 2001 to 73.4% in 2011, slightly higher than the 70.0% Borough wide.
- Just over a quarter (25.4%) of Newport East's residents have level 4 and above qualifications, higher than the 20.9% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- The large majority of Newport East residents (82.3%) reported good or very good health, above the 80.2% Borough wide.
- Some 17.2% of the ward's residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, similar to the 17.0% seen in 2001, and below the Borough wide 18.6%.
- One in ten (10.1%) of Newport East residents provide some level of unpaid care, a slight increase from 9.8% in 2001 and slightly below the Borough figure of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
