
# Newport South – 2011 Census Profile



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# 1 Population Characteristics

### **Summary:**


- Population in Newport South increased by 5.3% between 2001 and 2011, with population density of 22.7, more than four times higher than the Borough wide population density of 5.7.
- In the decade prior to the 2011 Census, the 65+ population increased from 18.2% to 22.8%.
- Compared to the Borough wide age profile, Newport West was found to be older; in particular, just 15.2% of the ward's population were aged 0-15 compared with 20.5% for the Borough and nearly a quarter (22.8%) of the ward were aged 65 and over compared to 14.4% Borough wide.
- Newport South has a large proportion of males aged 20-24 compared to Borough wide.

# 2 Diversity

# Summary:

- The BME population of Newport South increased by 45.3% from a small base between 2001 and 2011, representing just 3.5% of the population, a third of the 10.6% seen across the Borough.
- Beside White British, the 'Other White' population remained the largest at 1.3%, but still lower than Borough-wide (4.2%).
- Even though the number of Christians decreased by more than 200 people, it remains the largest religious group in the ward at 70.8%, above the Borough proportion of 61.7%.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Just 1.4% of Newport South residents have a main language other than English, lower than the 4.1% seen Borough wide.

# 3 Household and family characteristics

### Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,139 occupied household spaces in Newport South accommodating 2,605 people, an average household size of 2.29, slightly lower than the 2.47 Borough wide.
- Since 2001, the proportion of one person households has increased slightly from 25.5% to 27.6%, above the Borough rate of 25.2%
- The largest household type in the ward is one person households aged 65 and over at a rate of 15.1%, higher than the Borough wide 10.7%.
- Some 14.7% of households in Newport South have no access to a car or van, lower than the Borough wide figure (20.6%).
- More than two in five (44.5%) of households in the ward are not deprived in any dimension, a large increase from 32.6% in 2001 and above the Borough figure of 41.7%.

# 4 Housing

#### **Summary:**

- The total number of household spaces in Newport South has increased by 41 since 2001 with the proportion of unoccupied household spaces remaining fairly stable.
- The predominant accommodation type in the ward is semi-detached houses or bungalows with more than two in five households (41.0%) living in this type of accommodation, higher than the Borough rate of 36.7%.
- Three quarters (75.5%) of households in Newport South own their home, considerably higher than the 63.7% ownership in the Borough.
- A total of 37 households (3.2%) still mistakenly believe they rent their home from the Council, a decrease from 56 households (5.1%) in 2001.
- The proportion of households in Newport privately renting their home has increased from 7.1% in 2001 to 12.3% in 2011, lower than the 14.9% Borough wide.

# 5 Employment and economy

### Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Newport South decreased from 69.7% to 66.2%, below the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- The unemployment rate in the ward increased very slightly from 2.1% to 2.3% in the decade preceding the census but is still more than half the Borough rate of 4.7%.
- Some 4.5% of Newport South residents aged 16-74 have never worked, well below the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The predominant profession group in the ward is 'professional occupations' (15.7%) higher proportionally in the ward than Borough wide (13.9%).
- More than a third (36.1%) of Household Reference Persons in Newport South are classed as social grade C1 supervisory, clerical, junior, managerial/administrative/professional, larger proportionally than Borough wide (28.3%).
- The proportion of residents in employment in the ward who drive to work in a car or van has increased from 64.2% in 2001 to 70.4% in 2011, similar to the 70.0% Borough wide.
- Just over a quarter (25.4%) of Newport South's residents have level 4 and above qualifications, higher than the 20.9% Borough wide.

### 6 Health and care

### **Summary:**

- The majority of Newport South residents (79.5%) reported good or very good health, very slightly below the 80.2% Borough wide.
- Some 21.4% of the ward's residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, higher than the 19.1% seen in 2001, and above the Borough wide 18.6%.
- Some 12.4% of Newport South residents provide some level of unpaid care, an increase from 11.6% in 2001 and higher than the Borough figure of 10.8%.

# **Notes and definitions**

### **Household deprivation**

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

### **Household Reference Persons**

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
  - Economically active, employed, full-tine, non-student
  - Economically active, employed, full-time student
  - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
  - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
  - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
  - Economically active, unemployed, student
  - Economically inactive, retired
  - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP us the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

## **Dependent children**

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
