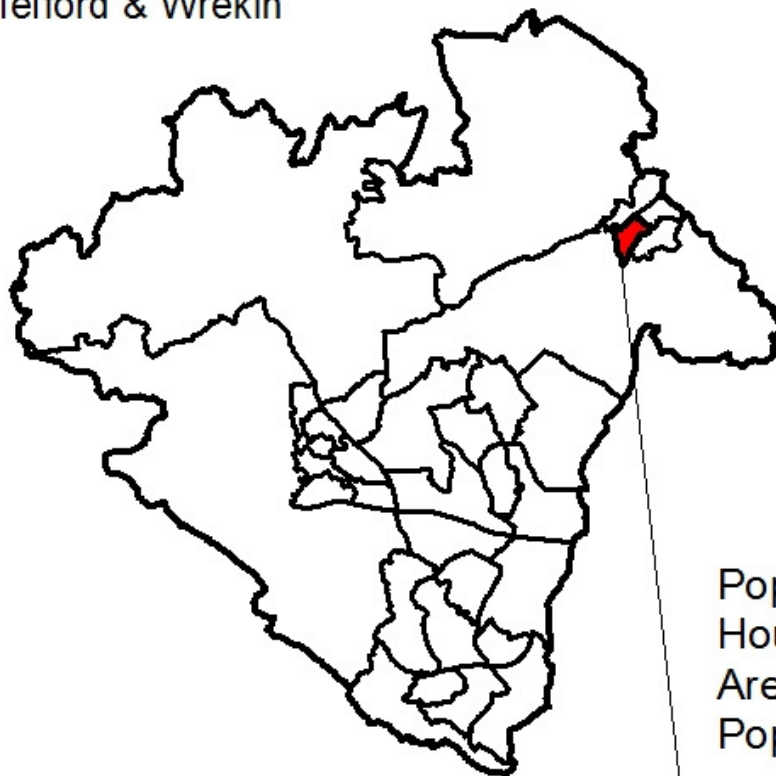
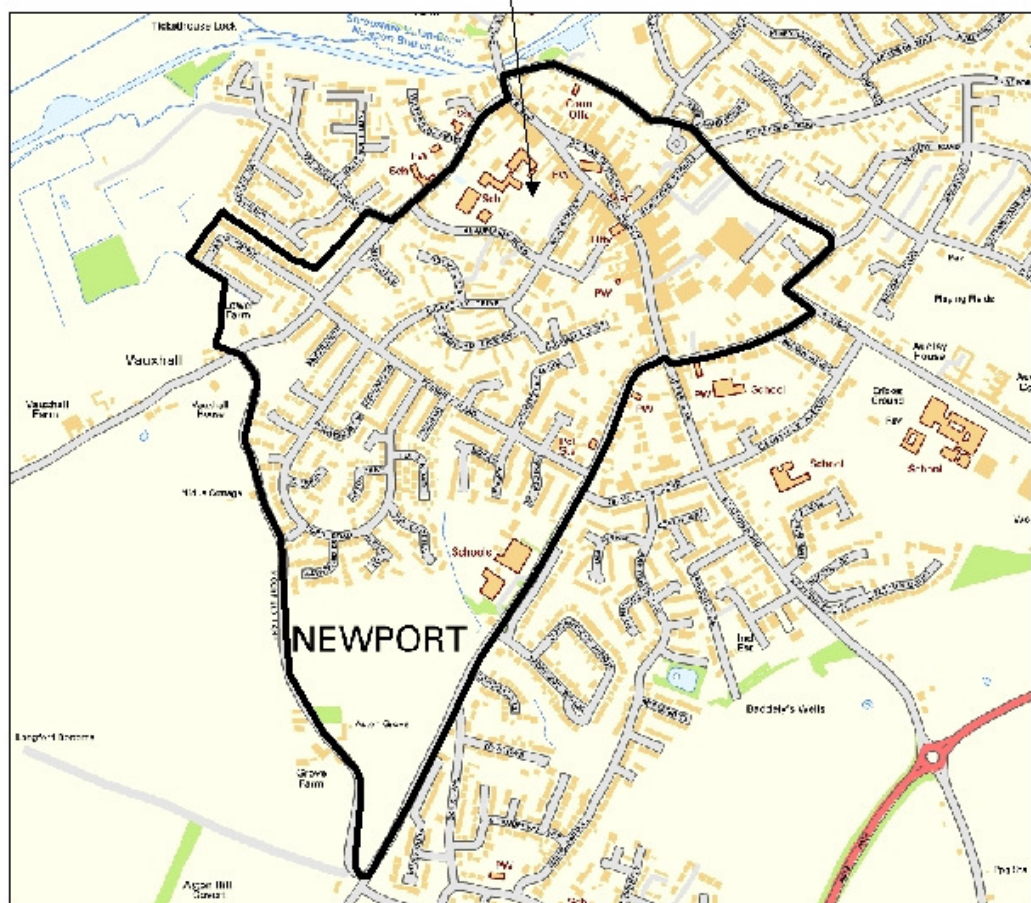

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

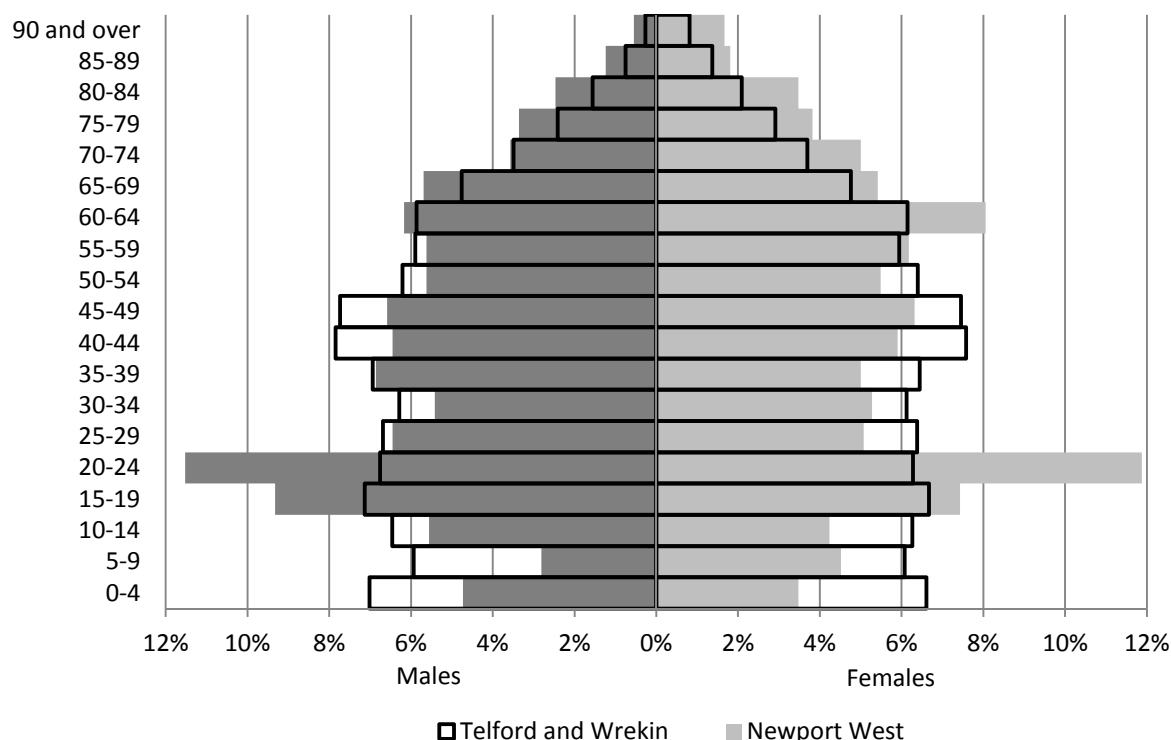
- The population of Newport West increased by 6.3% between 2001 and 2011. The population density of Newport West is 37.1, more than six times higher than the Borough wide population density of 5.7.
- In the decade prior to the 2011 Census, Newport West saw an increase in the 0-4 and 10-15 age groups, but a fall in the 5-9. In total the under 16 population of the ward grew by 89.5%.
- Newport West's population is dominated by the 20-24 age group, with higher proportions than the Borough wide due to the ward's proximity to Harper Adams University with a large student population.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Newport West increased by 51.7% between 2001 and 2011, representing 6.3% of the population compared to 10.6% across the Borough.
- Beside White British, the 'White Other' population remained the largest ethnic group in the ward at 2.7%, very little change from 2.6% in 2001 and slightly lower than Borough-wide (3.2%).
- Even though the number of Christians decreased by nearly 300 people, it remains the largest religious group in the ward at 67.8%, above the Borough proportion of 61.7%.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Some 2.7% of Newport West residents have a main language other than English, lower than the 4.1% seen Borough wide.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,249 occupied household spaces in Newport West accommodating 2,805 people, an average household size of 2.25, slightly lower than the 2.47 Borough wide.
- Since 2001, the proportion of one person households has remained stable at 31.8%.
- The largest household type in the ward is 'other' (non aged 65 and over) one person households at a rate of 16.3%, slightly higher than the Borough wide 14.5%.
- A fifth (20.2%) of households in Newport West have no access to a car or van, similar to the Borough wide figure (20.6%).
- More than two in five (44.5%) of households in the ward are not deprived in any dimension, a large increase from 33.4% in 2001 and above the Borough figure of 41.7%.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The total number of household spaces in Newport West has increased by 61 since 2001 with an increase in the proportion of unoccupied household spaces from 2.7% to 4.2%.
- The predominant accommodation type in the ward is detached houses or bungalows with more than a third of households (36.3%) living in this type of accommodation, higher than the Borough rate of 30.8%.
- Some 61.6% of households in Newport West own their home, slightly lower than the 63.7% ownership in the Borough.
- A total of 49 households (3.9%) still believe they rent their home from the Council, a slight increase from 43 households (3.6%) in 2001.
- The proportion of households in Newport privately renting their home has increased from 12.7% in 2001 to 21.9% in 2011, higher than the 14.9% Borough wide.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Newport West decreased from 68.1% to 64.3%, below the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- The unemployment rate in the ward increased from 1.7% to 2.5% in the decade preceding the census but is still almost half the Borough rate of 4.7%.
- Some 8.2% of Newport West residents aged 16-74 have never worked, above the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The predominant profession group in the ward is 'professional occupations' (16.8%) higher proportionally in the ward than Borough wide (13.9%).
- More than a third (37.2%) of Household Reference Persons in Newport West are classed as social grade C1 – supervisory, clerical, junior, managerial/administrative/professional, larger proportionally than Borough wide (28.3%).
- The proportion of residents in employment in the ward who travel to work on foot has increased from 13.1% in 2001 to 15.1% in 2011, higher than the 8% Borough wide.
- Just under a quarter (23.0%) of Newport West's residents have level 4 and above qualifications, higher than the 20.9% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- The large majority of Shawburch residents (81.6%) reported good or very good health, slightly above the 80.2% Borough wide.
- Some 17.5% of the ward's residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, similar to the 17.6% seen in 2001, and slightly lower than the Borough wide 18.6%.
- Just 8.9% of Newport West residents provide some level of unpaid care, a decrease from 10.3% in 2001 and lower than the Borough figure of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
