


1 Population Characteristics

Summary:


- The population of Park decreased by 4.6% between 2001 and 2011. The population density of Park is 42.3, more than seven times higher than the Borough wide population density of 5.7.
- In the decade prior to the 2011 Census, the proportion of 65+ population increased from 20.3% in 2001 to 25.1%.
- Compared to the Borough wide age profile, Park was found to be older; with the proportions of those aged 35 and under less than seen Borough wide.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Park increased by 21.3% between 2001 and 2011, representing 5.2% of the population half the 10.6% seen Borough wide.
- Beside White British, the 'Other White' population remained the largest ethnic group in the ward at 2.3%, very little change from 2.2% in 2001 and lower than Borough-wide (3.2%).
- Even though the number of Christians in Park decreased by more than 400 people, it still remained the largest religious group in the ward at 71.2%.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Just 1.4% of the ward had a main language other than English, less than half the 4.1% Borough wide.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,073 occupied household spaces in Arleston accommodating 2,492 people, an average household size of 2.32, slightly lower than the 2.47 average household size Borough wide.
- Since 2001, the proportion of one person households in the ward has increased from 23.9% to 26.8%, above the Borough rate of 25.2%.
- The largest household type in the ward is one person aged 65 and over at a rate of 15.48, higher than the Borough wide 10.7%.
- Some 18.4% of households in Park have no access to a car or van lower than the Borough wide rate 20.6%.
- The proportion of households in the ward not deprived in any dimensions has increased from 29.4% in 2001 to 41.7% in 2011, the same as the Borough rate.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The total number of household spaces in Park has decreased by 17 since 2001 with an slight decrease in the proportion of unoccupied household spaces from 0.8% to 0.6%.
- The predominant accommodation type in the ward is semi-detached houses or bungalows at 69.3%, nearly twice the Borough rate of 36.7%.
- More than four out of five households in Park (82.5%) own their own home, considerably higher than the 63.7% ownership across the Borough.
- A total of 42 households (3.9%) still believe they rent their home from the Council, a decrease from 52 households (4.8%) in 2001.
- The number of households in Park renting their home from a private landlord or letting agency has increased fourfold since 2001, although at 6.8% of all households in the ward is still considerably lower than the 13.6% Borough wide.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Park increased slightly from 65.1% to 68.5%, just below the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- The unemployment rate in the ward increased slightly from 2.0% to 2.8% in the decade preceding the census, almost half the Borough rate of 4.7%.
- A total of 4.6% of Park residents aged 16-74 have never worked, below the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The predominant occupation in Park is 'administrative and secretarial' at 14.0%, higher than the 11.5% seen Borough wide.
- More than a third (33.9%) of Household Reference Persons in Park are classed social grade C1. Supervisory, clerical, junior managerial/administrative/professional, higher than the proportion of residents Borough wide in this category (28.3%).
- Two thirds (66.9%) of Park residents travel to work by driving a car or van, an increase from 63.0% in 2001, but still below the Borough rate of 70.0%.
- Just over a quarter (26.6%) of Park residents aged 16+ have no qualifications, slightly higher than the 24.6% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- Three quarters (75.7%) of residents of Park reported good or very good health lower than the 80.2% Borough wide.
- Some 17.5% residents in the ward felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, slightly lower than the Borough figure of 18.6%.
- The number of residents in the ward who provide unpaid care decreased slightly between 2001 and 2011, but at 11.6% is still higher than the Borough rate of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
