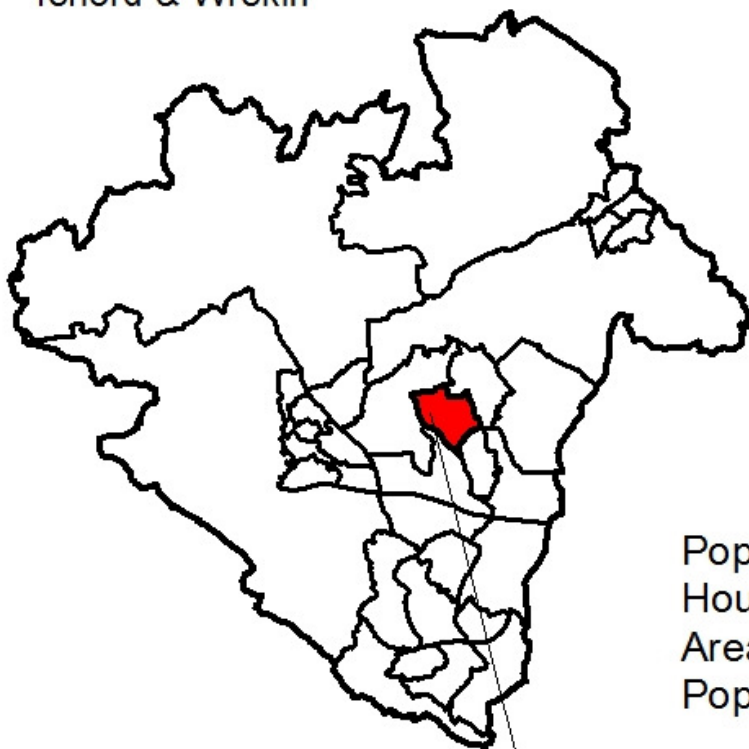
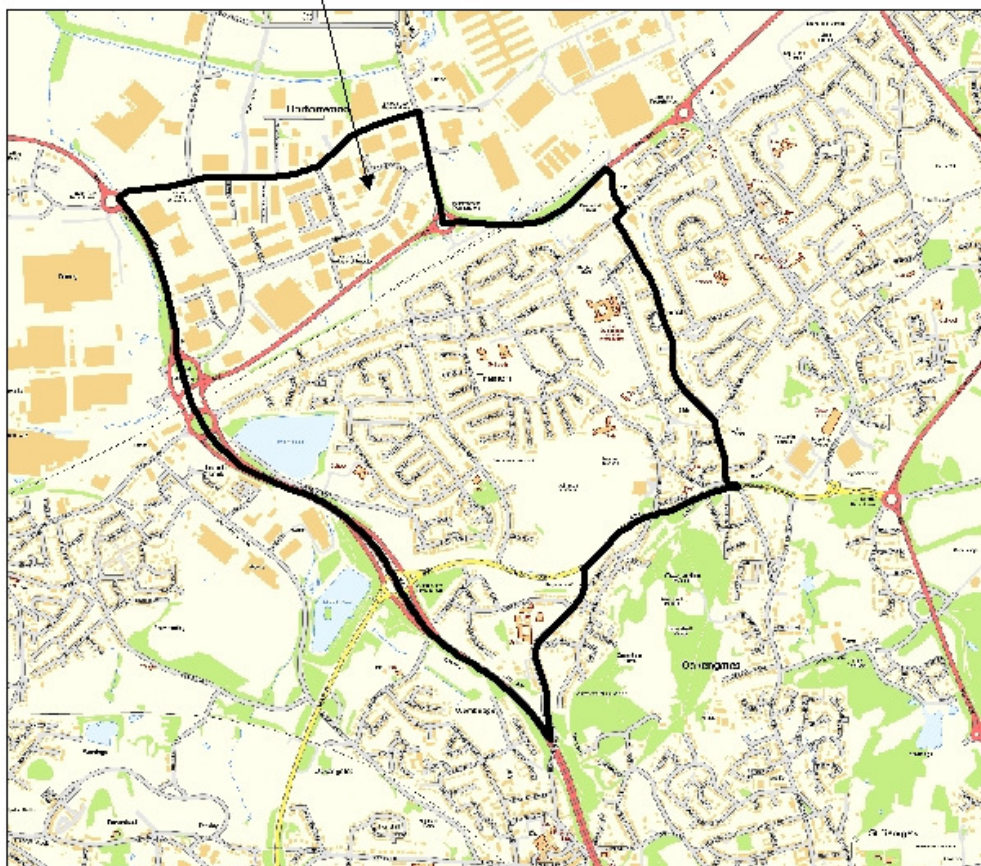

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

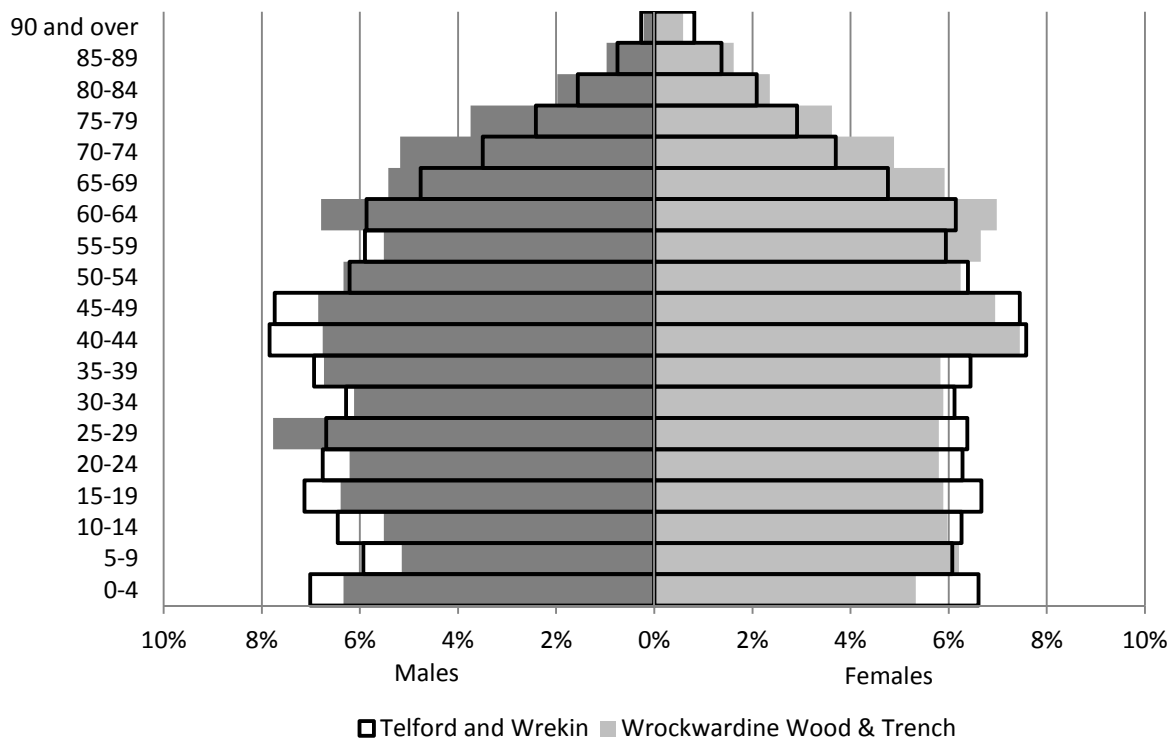
- Wrockwardine Wood & Trench’s population decreased by 1.6%, some 109 people, between 2001 and 2011.
- In the decade preceding the 2011 Census the 85+ population of Wrockwardine Wood & Trench more than doubled.
- The 5-15 population has decreased since 2011 with a very small increase in 0-4s.
- The ward has higher proportions of age groups aged 60 and over compared to Borough wide.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Wrockwardine Wood & Trench grew by 32.2% between 2001 and 2011, accounting for 14.0% of the ward's total population, higher than Borough wide (10.6%).
- Despite a decrease of 73 people, the Asian/Asian British group remains the largest BME group in the ward.
- The 'Other White' group has more than doubled in the ward since 2001 and at 4.0% of the population is a larger proportion than Borough wide.
- Although the proportion of Christians decreased from 75.6% to 64.8%, it still remained the largest religious group in the ward. The proportion of the wards population with no religion more than doubled.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Out of the 5.8% of the population whose main language is not English, the majority can speak English well or very well (4.1% of the population).

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 2,724 occupied household spaces in Wrockwardine Wood & Trench accommodating 6,671 people, giving an average household size of 2.45, in line with the Borough wide household size of 2.47.
- Almost a quarter (23.8%) of households in Wrockwardine Wood & Trench are one person households, similar to the Borough rate of 25.2%.
- The predominant household type in the ward is married couples without children (15.3%), a change from 2001 when the predominant type was married couples with dependent children.
- Nearly a fifth (19.5%) of households in the ward does not have access to a car, in line with the Borough average. The average number of cars per household is 1.22, a slight increase since 2001.
- Just seven households in Wrockwardine Wood & Trench (0.3%) are deprived across all four dimensions. More than a third (35.3%) are not deprived in any dimensions, lower than the 41.7% Borough wide.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The number of household spaces in Wrockwardine Wood & Trench has decreased by 29 since 2001.
- The majority of households in the ward (63.2%) live in semi-detached houses or bungalows, considerably higher than the Borough rate for this type of housing (36.7%).
- More than a third (36.6%) of households in the ward own their homes outright, with a further 35.3% owning through a mortgage or loan.
- A total of 171 households mistakenly believe they rent their home from the Council, a slight increase since 2001.
- The number of households in Wrockwardine Wood & Trench privately renting their home has more than doubled since 2001, as seen Borough wide.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the proportion of economically active population in Wrockwardine Wood & Trench remained stable, slightly below the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- Unemployment rate in the ward increased from 2.6% to 4.5% in 2011.
- A total of 6.0% of Wrockwardine Wood & Trench residents aged 16-74 have never worked, below the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The number of ward residents in 'caring, leisure and other service occupations' has increased by a third since 2001 from 193 to 299.
- The proportion of 'managers, directors and senior officials' in Wrockwardine Wood has fallen from 9.6% in 2001 to 7.2% where as the proportion employed in 'professional occupations' has increased by two thirds, but at 8.1% is lower than the Borough figure of 13.9%.
- More than a third (35.5%) of Household Reference Persons in Apley Castle are classed as social grade DE - Semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers / On state benefit, unemployed, lowest grade workers, higher than the Borough rate of 30.8%.
- Three in ten Wrockwardine Wood & Trench residents (29.5%) aged 16+ have no qualifications, higher than the Borough rate of (24.6%).

6 Health and care

Summary:

- Just over three quarters (78%) of people in Wrockwardine Wood & Trench reported good or very good health, slightly lower than the Borough figure of 80.2%.
- A total of 1,377 ward residents, some 20.6%, felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, slightly higher than the Borough figure of 18.6%.
- Some 11.6% of residents in Wrockwardine Wood & Trench provided unpaid care, slightly higher than the 10.8% seen Borough wide.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
