

How do you want your place to change by 2030?

The Council is planning the future for Telford and Wrekin - we are calling this plan 'Shaping Places'.

Shaping Places will set out where new homes, jobs, green space etc. should be built. Please read the following facts about your area and answer the questions on the back page.

Homes



On average, more than 600 new homes have been built in Telford and Wrekin each year for the last fifteen years. New homes equal 1% of all existing homes.

Most new homes have been built in Telford. The number of new homes built in rural areas and in Newport has been much less.



Not everyone can afford to own their own home.

There are over 17,000 people needing a home on the housing register.

Green spaces



90% of the borough is green space such as farmland, woodland, gardens, parks, sports facilities, lakes and ponds.



Our landscape is a special mix of town and country. Green space is valuable to all communities, it encourages physical activity and attracts businesses to the area.

Jobs



26% of local jobs are in public sector, education, and health;
23% are in distribution, hotels, and restaurants;
22% are in finance, IT, business activities;
19% are in manufacturing;
5% are tourism related;
4% in transport and communications.



Some of Telford's industrial estates are old and need improving.

Shopping



Outside central Telford, the main shopping centres are the market towns of Wellington, Newport, Oakengates, Madeley, Dawley, Hadley and Donnington.

The market town of Newport is the main centre for people living in the rural area. Shopping facilities in rural villages are very limited.

We want everyone to have an opportunity to comment on the **Shaping Places** plan. The plan will take about 2 years to produce, the stages are shown below.





Health



The local population is living longer, so will need more healthcare facilities and better homes including care homes.



28% of children and adults in Telford and Wrekin are obese.

Travel



Telford was designed for car travel. Most local workers use a car or van to travel to work, 8% walk, 5% use the bus, and 3% cycle.



Many local people don't have access to a car, and want good quality walking, cycling, taxi and bus facilities. Public transport is particularly poor in the rural areas.

Energy



We could make our own energy locally using the natural resources of the wind and sun.



18% of Telford and Wrekin households cannot afford to keep warm. Rising energy costs will cause difficulties, particularly for older people, those on low incomes, and those living in rural areas.
