Cycle Circus

An engaging one hour workshop where groups rotate through a number of activities including; arts and crafts, hi-vis dressing up, labelling a bike, story time and picture puzzles. Pedestrian Training

A scheme which increases children's knowledge of the Green Cross Code and teaches them age appropriate pavement behaviour skills. A classroom based workshop followed by accompanied walks in the local area. A pre and post evaluation takes place, outliers are highlighted and results are fed back to the class teacher. Feedback on this scheme has been excellent with post evaluation results consistently high.

SEND Pedestrian Training

Training is tailored and practical to the particular needs of the pupil. Progress is monitored and evaluations completed before and after each session. Small groups can work well but risk will be assessed and some pupils may benefit from being trained individually. A minimum of two sessions for each pupil are required. Trainers are empathetic and experienced.

Be Bright Be Seen Workshop

This workshop has been developed with primary phase teachers, it covers maths, literacy and science aspects of the curriculum.

It is a short science project where children learn all about reflective and high visibility materials and the importance of using them, especially in the winter months. By making a prediction, completing a fun experiment and analysing their results, pupils can find out which colours are the most effective. It can be run during curriculum or PPA time.

Learn to Ride

These sessions will teach children a skill for life whilst developing key motor skills and helping to encourage more active travel. During the sessions children will learn techniques to improve balance and co-ordination with an end goal of riding a two wheeled bike independently. Scooter Skills

(Level 1 ONLY course)

This is for pupils who **can already ride without stabilisers**. Aimed at early KS2, Bikeability Level 1 offers a taster of things to come in years 5 or 6.

Riders will gain a greater understanding of the mechanics of cycling and improve skills through a series of games and challenges. Delivered on your school playground, the nationally recognised programme will stir up an enthusiasm for an active lifestyle and help develop key motor skills.

Bikeability

(Level 1 & 2 Combined Course)

Equipping cyclists of the future with the skills and confidence to cycle on today's roads.

Level 1 covers bike handling skills in a traffic free environment.

Level 2 takes place on local streets, giving trainees a real cycling experience. Trainees learn how to deal with traffic on short journeys such as cycling to school or the local shops. Training leads to greater independence and promotes a healthy and active lifestyle.

Bike Maintenance

Bike Maintenance sessions teach children how to perform basic repair on their bikes and when run prior to Bikeability it can make sure that bikes are roadworthy before the start of the course.

By working on their bikes children will have a better understanding of how their bike functions. They can go on and teach their friends, or it may even spark an interest in learning more about mechanics.

All children who take part in the workshop will receive a glue-less puncture repair kit.

Parents Parking Promise

Designed to tackle parents parking inconsiderately around the school. Parents sign a 'promise' agreeing that they will drive and park carefully and considerately around the school (should they need to bring a car to school). In return for signing the promise parents will be given a 'Parents Parking Promise' car sticker to display in their car window. The sticker acts as a reminder to themselves and others that they have promised to be considerate.

The 'promise' can be adapted to meet the needs of your own school.

Upon signing up to the scheme you will receive; A bespoke parent letter, a bespoke map and 50 x Parking Promise stickers.

Walking Bus support

A Walking Bus can be run by school staff, volunteers or both. Adults take it in turns to walk to school in an organised group starting from a fixed point at a fixed time. The Walking Bus may have stops on the way for more children to join and usually runs every day. Participants wear hi-vis to help them to be safer near traffic. The scheme has many benefits including improving pupil attendance and tackling lateness. The scheme has very little set up costs and can be virtually free to run.

Park & Stride support

A Park & Stride scheme is ideal for families who live too far away from school to be able to walk the whole journey. It is a simple solution and means that children at least walk some of the way to and from school. It is also good for parents who have to drive on to work. Parents are encouraged to park away from the school and walk the last five or ten minutes. They may park in a pub or supermarket car park with the agreement of the owners or just in a quiet side street. By setting up a Park & Stride you can tackle congestion head on.

School Crossing Patrol

A School Crossing Patrol (SCP) helps children and adults to cross the road safely on their way to and from school. Historically known as 'Lollipop Ladies' this service can encourage children to walk to school more often as parents have peace of mind knowing the SCP will help their child cross a particular busy or challenging road on their journey. Patrols are recruited, trained and managed by the Council.
