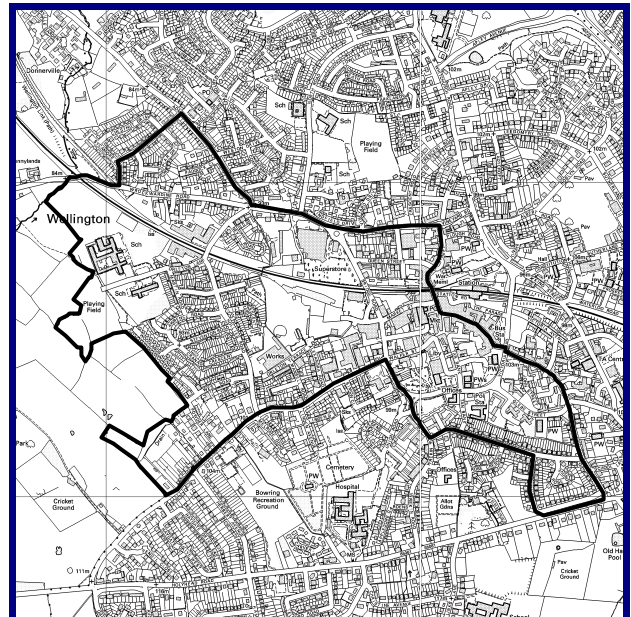


1.1. HAYGATE

OVERVIEW

- Located in west Wellington, Haygate saw a population decline of some -2.3% between 1991 and 2001 and an increase of some 7.3% in the number of households. These changes resulted in the average household size falling from 2.3 to 2.1 people.
- In 2001, Haygate had a relatively old population profile, in particular, some 20.2% of the population were aged 65+ compared to the Borough-wide average of 12.4%. At 18.0%, the ward had the second highest ward rate for 65 to 84 year olds.
- Although Haygate had a below average proportion of children, the ward still had the fourth highest economic dependency ratio in the Borough.
- Reflecting the ward's older age profile, some 20.1% of households in Haygate were found to contain only a single pensioner - the highest rate in the Borough.
- Some 38.0% of households in Haygate rented their home from a social landlord – the third highest ward rate in the Borough.
- Almost one in four dwellings in the ward were flats – the third highest ward rate in the Borough.
- The proportion of households without access to a car in Haygate was the highest ward rate in the Borough – 39.4% compared to 22.4% Borough-wide.
- Haygate had the second highest ward rate in the Borough for residents with a long-term illness. Almost one in four residents of Haygate had a long-term illness compared with 18.0% Borough-wide. Moreover, only 60.7% of residents described their health as good, the lowest ward rate in the Borough..
- Some 3.3% of residents provided unpaid care for 50 hours or more a week – the third highest ward rate in the Borough.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Census

The 2001 Census was carried out on the 29th April. As the response rate was 94.2% in the Borough, it was necessary for the Office for National Statistics (ONS) to impute missing responses. **All data from the Census are therefore estimates and subject to standard error.**

In order to monitor local trends, 1991 Census data has been modelled to 2001 ward boundaries. Whilst every effort has been made to ensure that this exercise produces accurate results, it must be remembered that at best the 1991 data included in this report are estimates.

Due to rounding, table columns in this document may not sum to the presented total.

Migration

A migrant is defined as a person with a different address one year before the Census to that on Census Day.

Ethnicity

The 2001 Census was the first Census to use the "mixed" ethnicity response.

Dependent Children

A dependent child is a person in a household aged 0-15 years (whether or not in a family) or a person aged 16-18 who is a full-time student and in a family with parents

Economic Activity

The economically active population is more usually defined as all people aged 16+ who are either full or part time employees, self employed, unemployed or a full time student who is working. To date, ONS have only published data for 16-74 year olds, excluding residents who are 75+ and economically active. It has not been possible to produce ward based estimates of the economically active population from the 1991 Census which excludes those who are aged 75+. However, the percentage of economically active people

who were aged 75+ in the 1991 Census was less than 0.13%.

Economic Dependency Ratio

The economic dependency ratio is the ratio between people of working age, 16 to 65, and the rest of the population. A high rate indicates that there are disproportionately more people not of working age in a population than working age.

Unemployment Rate

The Census definition of unemployment is broader and therefore produces a higher unemployment rate than the measure normally used by ONS (residents claiming Job Seekers Allowance).

Long-term Limiting Illness

An illness, health problem or disability which limits daily activities or the work a person can do.

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
