

TELFORD & WREKIN COUNCIL (THE WREKIN, TELFORD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2020

Notice is hereby given that the Borough of Telford and Wrekin in exercise of its powers under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following order: **TELFORD & WREKIN COUNCIL (THE WREKIN, TELFORD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2020**

1. This Experimental Order will come into effect on Friday 21st August 2020 for a period not exceeding eighteen months.

2. The effect of this Experimental Order: is parking will be prohibited at all times along the sides and lengths of road as described in the table below.

Schedule	
1. Ercall Lane, Telford, (both sides)	from a point 50m north east of its junction with Forest Glen to M54 junction in a north easterly direction for a distance of 1290m
2. Forest Glen To Junction 7 M54, Telford, (both sides)	from a point 15m north of its junction with Wrekin Course in a northerly direction for a distance of 20m
3. Forest Glen To Spout Lane Junction, Telford (both sides)	from a point 140m south of its junction with Ercall Lane in a southerly direction for a distance of 930m
4. Wrekin Course, Telford, (both sides)	from a point 15m west of its junction with Forrest Glen to M54 junction in a westerly direction for a distance of 20m

4. In due course, the Council will consider whether or not the provisions of the Experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Within a period of six months beginning with the day on which the Experimental Order came into force, or if any or all of the Experimental Order provisions are varied or modified by the Council, beginning with the day the latest variation or modification came into force, any person may object to the making permanent of the Experimental Order.
