SCHOOL BECOMES AWARE OF SUSPECTED CASE OF COVID-19

(Symptomatic* pupil or staff member)

* First stage COVID19 symptoms in young children can include gastrointestinal problems (e.g. diarrhoea of a persistent nature – not just one loose bowel movement). If the ONLY symptom is gastrointestinal, the child should be excluded for 48 hours and monitored for other COVID19 symptoms – if no other symptoms present, the child can return to EY/CM when they have been free of any symptom for 48 hours.

Follow actions in Cleaning Guidance document

Review school risk assessment



Make list of all people in direct or close contact with the case without PPE (bubbles, office etc.)**

Assists with preparing COVID-19 communication, if school has a T&W communication package

Household stops self-isolating

Suspected case stops selfisolating when symptom free for 48 hours*** **NEGATIVE**

Return to normal – staff or pupil can return to school. No further action needed.

PHE

Closes case & notifies

POSITIVE

Household completes 14 days selfisolating

ALL people on the contact list selfisolate for 14 days

Suspected case completes 10 days self-isolating & returns to school when symptom free for 48 hours***

Instruct ALL on contact list to self- isolate for 14 days.

Prepare general & media statements with HPH, as needed

Work with HPH team to manage the ongoing situation

Assists school with control of outbreak communication of situation, as needed

Contacts include those who have had: **Direct contact: Face to face contact with a case for any length of time, within 1m, including: being coughed on, a face to face conversation, or having skin-to-skin physical contact, or any contact within one metre for one minute or longer without face-to-face contact. **Close contact**: a person who has been within 2 metres of a case for more than 15 minutes.

***If a cough or a loss or change in normal sense of smell or taste is the only persistent symptom, staff & children can return to school if they ae medically fit as these symptoms are known to persist for several weeks in some cases
