3. If you have symptoms, select 'Yes, at least one of these symptoms', press continue and then enter the date the symptoms. If you do not have symptoms select 'No, none of these symptoms'

For example, the Oxford vaccine trial.

Visiting a drive-through test site: what you need to know

About the test

- you need to book your test appointment as soon as possible
- you or someone you live with must drive to the test site by car, small van or motorbike (some sites do not accept motorbikes)
- site staff will tell you if an assistant does the swab test for you or if you do it yourself
- do not go to the site if you're very unwell or if you're at high risk (shielding) from coronavirus – <u>choose a home test instead</u>

Who can have it

You can get a test for yourself and up to 3 other people you live with who have coronavirus symptoms.

In England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, a child can have a test whatever their age.

What happens at a drive-through site

If you're arriving by car or small van, everyone must be in the same vehicle and sit next to a window that opens. You'll stay in your vehicle during your visit.

A maximum of 2 people can arrive on the same motorbike and they must wear a full helmet and visor.

What you'll need to continue

To book your test appointment, you'll need:

- your mobile phone number
- · the registration number of your vehicle, if you're going to a drive-through
- the name and mobile number of any other people you live with who will be tested

Do not turn up without an appointment.

It's 10 digits long, and usually on prescriptions or a hospital or GP letter.

In Scotland, it's known as a CHI number. In Northern Ireland, it's known as an H&C number.

- 30. Check your answers, if you need to amend any, select 'Change' next to each entry, then press save and continue
- 31. Select 'Save and continue', unless you'd like to add other people you live with for testing. You can add up to 3 other household members.

Confirm people for testing

You can add up to 3 people you live with for testing.

A maximum of 2 people can arrive on the same motorbike. If you plan to travel by motorbike, you can only get a test for you and one other person you live with.

Once you've confirmed who needs testing, you can continue.
