TELFORD AND WREKIN COUNCIL (HORTON LANE) (PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2020

Notice is hereby given that, on 11th December 2020, Borough of Telford and Wrekin, ("the Council") under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and all other enabling powers made the following Experimental Traffic Order:

TELFORD AND WREKIN COUNCIL (HORTON LANE) (PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2020

- 1. This Experimental Order will come into effect on Monday 21st December 2020 and continue for a period of eighteen months unless the Council decides to modify or suspend the operation of the Order at an earlier date.
- 2. The effect of this Experimental Order is that Motor Vehicles and non-mechanically propelled vehicles (excluding cyclists) will be prohibited at all times from proceeding along on the 20 metre length of Horton Lane, Telford, specified in the Schedule to this Notice. This prohibition will prevent vehicles, but not pedestrians, cyclists and horseriders, from entering or exiting Horton Lane at its junction with Hortonwood 60. The Order will not prevent or restrict use of the remainder of Horton Lane

3. Exemptions will be provided in the Order for emergency vehicles.

Schedule (Prohibition of Motor Vehicles)	
Road Name	Length
Horton Lane - from the northern kerb line of its junction with Hortonwood 60	For a distance of 20 metres in a north-westerly direction.

In due course, the Council will consider whether or not the provisions of the Experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Within a period of six months beginning with the day on which the Experimental Order came into force, or if any or all of the Experimental Order provisions are varied or modified by the Council, beginning with the day the latest variation or modification came into force, any person may object to the making permanent of the Experimental Order. Any such objection must be sent in writing to Network Management, Neighbourhood & Customer Services, Telford & Wrekin Council, Darby House, TF2 4JA or traffic.schemes@telford.gov.uk stating the grounds on which the objection is being made.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
