# Broken Hearing Aids / Repairs

If you have a broken hearing aid that requires repair please contact your Teacher of the Deaf as usual and we can sort a repair through Mark Rutter our Hearing Aid Technician. Alternatively both hospitals in their outpatient receptions have a 'box' where you can deposit a broken hearing aid. Please ensure it is in suitable packaging and your child's name is enclosed. This may be quicker on some occasions than going through your Teacher of the Deaf.

### Audiology Survey

A new audiology patient survey has been launched by NHS Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) to gather patients' views on the current service and how it may be improved. The aim of the survey is to assess different areas of the adult and children audiology services including the care received by patients, aftercare, waiting times and access to appointments. It will also identify any potential improvements which could be made to the services to enhance patient experience.

### **Transition Appointments**

At the moment children in Year 11 (16 years of age) all have a transition appointment with the Audiology Department as part of the process of the move to Adult Services. At this point the CYP meet a Hearing Therapist who discusses the move to adult services and how the system works. They also signpost to resources etc for 'life' as an adult with hearing loss Following that appointment the CYP are booked for a yearly review. After that, as for adults with hearing loss, appointments are 'self-booked'. In light of compulsory education moving to 18 (Year 13) the transition appointment will move to Year 13 with the same follow up as described above. This pattern of appointments will be the same for children with additional learning difficulties alongside their hearing impairment. This does not affect the support patterns from SIS. Therefore:

- If your child is in Year 11 now things will continue as before and then they will receive a 'transition' appointment in Year 13.
- If your child is in Year 12/13 now they will continue with the pattern of Audiological support they have now as they should have had a transition appointment already.

There will be some CYP who do leave more formal education at Year 11 such as apprenticeships where SIS do not in most circumstances continue with support. It is likely these students will be offered a transition appointment when their pathway is clear and will then move over to adult services.

### Ear Care Nurse (ECN) / Wax removals

If a CYP have seen the ECN in the past for wax removal and are awaiting or require an appointment these can be arranged through your Teacher of the Deaf. We are still working to the previous criteria for wax removal i.e. preventing use of hearing aids due to comfort/ excessive feedback that can't be managed through volume controls. We are still trying to avoid new impressions for discolouration or the requirement for a new colour or transfer!! At the moment please do not ring in directly and go through your Teacher of the Deaf.

# Children's Hearing Services Clinic (CHSC)

In the near future it will be moving to 'Attend Anywhere' which will allow families to be 'live' in the clinic via video. You will be invited by letter if you are due an appointment in this clinic to see if this is feasible for individual families. At the moment we will not be having an allocated SIS slot as we used to. We can however bring up cases related to ENT issues at these sessions and also SIS can email consultants around particular cases. This seems to be working well at the moment.
