Aids and Equipment in the Kitchen

Kitchen Equipment

Perching Stool

What is it for? Used in the kitchen to allow for rest during meal preparation, washing up and related tasks. Used in the bedroom to assist with dressing or used in the bathroom at the sink

Considerations?

- The seat is slightly tilted to allow someone to perch, knees will be lower than the hips, the person will weight bear through their feet so feet must be flat on the floor to be at the correct height.
- The legs of the stool are splayed which may cause a trip hazard.
- Need to consider space in the room.
- Must be able to use both hands to assist with standing up to prevent tipping.
- Weight restrictions of product

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Kitchen Trolley

What is it for? Used to transport food and drinks from one room to another.

Considerations?

- Should not be used as a substitute for a walking aid.
- The person must have a good walking balance
- Consider flooring due to wheels; thick carpet or rugs will make it difficult to use and smooth flooring will limit the control a person will have on the equipment especially if they were to fall.
- Must be able to use both hands to assist with standing up to prevent tipping.
- Weight restrictions of product

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Food Preparation

Kitchen Workstation

What is it for? There are several variations of this, typically they help to steady food while preparing. Some have cheese graters, spikes to steady vegetables for peeling, scrubbing brushes or corners for steadying bread.

Considerations?


- Has sharp parts to it.
- There are varying combinations available.
- Can be tricky to clean.

One Cup Kettle

What is it for? Safer way to prepare hot drinks as it removes the need to lift a heavy kettle with boiling water, reducing risk of spills and burns.

Considerations?

Still requires a good range of movement to fill the unit or needs someone to do this for the person.

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Automatic Jar Opener

What is it for? Opening jars, the jaws grip the jar and turns the jar lid

Considerations? Requires batteries, often not included.

Can Opener

What is it for? Automatically opens cans, alternative can openers are available

Considerations? Requires batteries, often not included. Where can I get it from?

Jar and Bottle openers

What is it for? Opening bottles and jars, suitable for someone who has the strength to turn a jar lid or bottle lid themselves but doesn't have a good grip. Alternative aids to open jars are also available.

Considerations? Need some physical strength for the turning action

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Wire Basket

What is it for? Typically a chip frying basket, can be used in a saucepan to boil vegetables and then the basket can be lifted when cooked and the pan of water can cool before being moved, rather than trying to move a pan of boiling water.


Considerations? Still require the strength to lift the pan of water, but will be doing this with cool water.

Oven Guards/Shelf Protectors

What is it for? To protect hands and arms when reaching for items in and out of the oven

Considerations? Available in a variety of colours but a bright colour (as pictured) may assist those with a visual impairment.

Silicone Oven Glove

What is it for? Allows for a freer movement and better grip when handling hot items than a mitten type glove can offer.

Considerations? Not as easy to put on as a typical oven glove.

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Angled Measuring Jug

What is it for? The angled measure makes it easier to read and has a gripped handle.

Considerations? Should not be put in dishwasher and avoid using in the microwave

Eating and Drinking

Cup Flask

What is it for? Keeps hot drinks warmer for longer, allows drink to be transported without spilling or burning and typically have an anti-slip base to prevent the cup from being knocked over.

Considerations? Product may still be too hot to drink Where can I get it from?

Two Handled Cup

What is it for? The two handles allow someone to stabilise the mug for transporting or drinking from to avoid spilling. Some also available with spout to reduce spillage. Considerations? Requires grip in both hands and still a chance of spilling hot drink

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Ergonomic Spoon

What is it for? The larger handle allows those with poor dexterity to grip the utensil. Often shaped to make them easier to use. Also available for forks and spoons. Grip for your existing cutlery is also available.

Considerations?

What is it for? To contain food on the plate, especially useful for those who can only eat one-handed. **Considerations?** Needs to be secured to the plate.
