<b>7</b>	Analyses the links between belief & practice	Give an example of what a Buddhist does, why they do it and explain it fully referring to other teachings connected with it, explaining the connection between the beliefs.	Being a vegetarian means that they do not harm any animals by killing them for food. They also do not harm humans. This means they would not join the army as this would involve killing humans. This is connected to Right Livelihood, which means that Buddhists should have jobs that help others not harm others. This is connected to their belief in reincarnation. If you do 'bad' things you get bad karma so you continue to be reincarnated. Harming an animal/human would give 'bad' karma. If you have 'good' karma you will hopefully achieve Enlightenment. Being a vegetarian will help in this.
