# Muslim thoughts on zakat....

## DONT FORGET YOUR ZAKAT

Zakat is a form of giving to those who are less fortunate. It is obligatory upon all Muslims to give 2.5 % of wealth and assets each year (in excess of what is required) to the poor. Done annually, giving Zakat is considered an act of worship because it is a form of offering thanks to God for the means of material well-being one has acquired.

- It is an act of worship.

- The money is used to help those who need it, for example, to provide food or clothing.

# Information on the 8 charities...

<p><u>Charity 1: Kid's Play!</u> Kid's Play is a charity which gives toys to children living in poverty. They operate both in the UK and abroad. Playing is an important part of a child's development and many children never have real toys. They spend 50% of money in the UK and 50% abroad.</p>	<p><u>Charity 2: Beat the Bully Drama Company.</u> Beat the Bully drama company visit different schools and put on performances about bullying and they also run workshops, getting young people to use drama as a means of exploring this issue. They do receive some government funding.</p>	<p><u>Charity 3: Barakabaho.</u> Barakabaho is a charity which works in the poorest places in Africa, giving communities animals which they can use to help them farm or they can breed the animals for food and sale. The charity is focused on helping people to help themselves.</p>	<p><u>Charity 4: Japanese Orphan Fund.</u> After the recent natural disaster in Japan, thousands of young children were orphaned and the government is struggling to cope. The charity seeks to work with the government building orphanages to house these children and make sure they are cared for.</p>
<p><u>Charity 5: Cat and Dog Inoculation Fund.</u> Millions of pets are not inoculated each year against diseases as their owners cannot afford them. This charity pays for these injections for people who cannot afford to have their pets vaccinated and publish material about why this is important.</p>	<p><u>Charity 6: Dreams Can Come True.</u> Dreams Can Come True makes the dreams of children dying of terminal diseases come true. They may pay for them to go to Disneyland or meet their favourite band. They have some support from celebrities who give up their some of their free time to help but need funding to help send young people on their dream holidays.</p>	<p><u>Charity 7: The Jimmy fund.</u> Jimmy was an elderly man who died of cancer and left all his money to the cancer ward on which he had been treated. The Jimmy fund makes sure that the cancer ward at the local hospital is run well and pays for the ward to be made to look nice. They also pay for accommodation of families who live far away so they can visit their relatives.</p>	<p><u>Charity 8: Without a home.</u> Without a home runs shelters for people who are homeless. They provide hot meals and showers for those who come to them but can only sleep 20% of those who ask for a bed. They also employ a doctor and nurse to give the homeless medicals, checking their health and try and get them appropriate housing and help them get back into work.</p>
