What is Sawm?



Sawm is fasting. It's the fourth of the Five Pillars of Islam.

Muslims are required to fast during Ramadan, the ninth month of the Islamic calendar.

Ramadan

Ramadan is a holy month for Muslims because it is when the *Qur'an* was revealed to Muhammad.

During Ramadan healthy adults *fast* during daylight. They eat breakfast before dawn and do not eat or drink again until the *iftar* meal when it is dark. Ramadan ends with the new moon and then Muslim families celebrate with a big feast called *Eid al Fitr*.
