TELFORD & WREKIN COUNCIL (HADLEY PARK ROAD, HADLEY & LEEGOMERY) (WAITING PROHIBITIONS) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDER 2021

Notice is hereby given that the Borough of Telford and Wrekin in exercise of its powers under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following order:

TELFORD & WREKIN COUNCIL (HADLEY PARK ROAD, HADLEY & LEEGOMERY) (WAITING PROHIBITIONS) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDER 2021

1. This Experimental Order will come into effect on 26th August 2021 for a period not exceeding eighteen months.
2. The effect of this Experimental Order is such that:
 - a. Parking will be prohibited at all times along the sides and lengths of road as described in Schedule 1

Schedule 1 (No Waiting at Any Time)

Column 1	Column 2
1. Hadley Park Road, Telford And Wrekin (the north-east side)	(Access to Woodpecker Close) From its junction with Hadley Park Road in a south-westerly and then a north-westerly direction following the kerb alignment for a distance of 44 metres.
2. Hadley Park Road, Telford And Wrekin (the south side)	(Access to Woodpecker Close) From its junction with Hadley Park Road in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 10 metres.
3. Hadley Park Road, Telford And Wrekin (the south side)	(Access to Woodpecker Close) Following the kerb alignment to a point 18 metres north-west of its junction with Hadley Park Road in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 10.5 metres.

2. In due course, the Council will consider whether or not the provisions of the Experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Within a period of six months beginning with the day on which the Experimental Order came into force, or if any or all of the Experimental Order provisions are varied or modified by the Council, beginning with the day the latest variation or modification came into force, any person may object to the making permanent of the Experimental Order.
