Telford and Wrekin Council (Coppice Drive, Newport) (Prohibitions of Waiting and School Entrance Clearway) Traffic Regulation Order 2021

 - Waiting will be prohibited at all times on the length of roads specified in Schedule One to this Order to the extent specified.
 - Stopping will be prohibited from 2.30pm to 3.30pm Monday to Friday inclusive on the lengths or roads specified in Schedule Two to this Order to the extent specified.

Schedule One (No waiting at any time)	
Coppice Drive, Telford And Wrekin (the east side)	From its junction with Deer Park Drive in a northerly direction for a distance of 10 metres.
2. Coppice Drive, Telford And Wrekin (the west side)	From its junction with Deer Park Drive in a northerly direction for a distance of 30 metres.

Schedule Two (No Stopping - School Keep Clear Mon-Fri 8am-5pm)	
Coppice Drive, Telford And Wrekin (the west side)	From a point 30 metres north of its junction with Deer Park Drive in a northerly and then an easterly direction following the kerb alignment of the hammer head for a distance of 25.6 metres.
