## Community Pride Fund

The Community Pride Fund is a £1.25 million scheme to help regenerate Telford and Wrekin. Businesses and groups applied for funding for a variety of different projects.

Two great Woodside projects will be taking place with help of this funding.

Families in Telford is a group that holds regular sessions for parents, carers and children under five. The grant will help build more learning facilities for those involved. This will bring in more equipment, storage containers, mats and beanbags and an update to facilities will mean cooking and modelling can be done. For adults, there will be new book loan schemes and support learning which parents can make the most of while children are busy playing.

One of the biggest projects that Community Pride is funding is a £100,000 grant for the Park Lane Centre. This will help fund a playbarn for children up to 8 years, with two separate areas for different ages. The kitchen will also be renovated so

### Job Box growing services as unemployment figures drop AGAIN!

Over the last year, the council has been committed to reducing youth unemployment in the borough. Through schemes such as Job Box and Young Telford, numbers of those claiming Job Seekers Allowance has fallen by a third.



Telford Job Box isn't just for 16-24 year olds; there are a range of services, education and employment support as well as 'Job Junctions' which offer help and advice to anyone in the borough seeking work and training. The scheme has also just launched 'Young Telford' which helps young people to start a business and provide everything needed to start and grow a self-employed career.

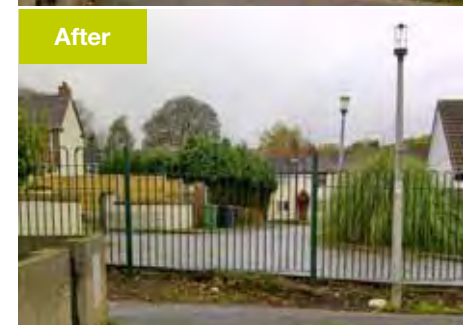

**Friends of Rough Park is a group which formed to look after the interests of Woodside. One completed project was making improvements to one of the main footpaths to create a path suitable for pushchairs and wheelchairs.**

The Friends received help from Severn Gorge Countryside Trust, Telford Green Spaces partnership groups, Madeley Town Council and the Community Payback Team. Their next idea is to develop a space that the whole family can enjoy, creating a purpose built-track for BMX bikes and scooters and a family picnic area.

The Friends will receive funding from the Ward Co-operative fund to make improvements to the footpaths and to insert steps on the steep slope in the park.

# Neighbourhood SNOW wardens

Could you be one?

**Telford & Wrekin Council has been busy recruiting a growing army of volunteers to help keep roads and pathways clear if and when the bad weather hits this winter.**

The Council already has 150 snow wardens and is looking to recruit a further 100 in the next year. Existing snow wardens are across the borough to ensure an even geographic spread and so that no areas get neglected.

Snow wardens clear and salt areas close to where they live that they identify as needing attention.

As a snow warden, they receive a high visibility vest, a pair of gloves, a snow shovel, a supply of salt and guidance on how to clear snow safely.

They cannot use the council's salt on private land, only the public highway.

# We're Watching You!!



Thoughtless dog owners

**A new campaign has set its sights on irresponsible dog owners after recent research showed that dog walkers are more likely to pick up after their dogs, when they think that they are being watched.**

Keep Britain Tidy recently carried out an experiment where dog walkers had 'eyes' on them at all times and that saw a reduction of 46% in the levels of dog fouling. Dog fouling is more common in the evenings and during the winter months, as some dog owners feel they can't be seen 'under the cover of darkness'.

In Telford and Wrekin, the council is working closely with Police Community Support Officers to increase patrols in areas where there are lots of reports of dog fouling.

We are giving away free poop scoop bags which can be picked up from Madeley Library.

So there's no excuse for not picking up after your dog.
