

Telford and Wrekin Council are committed to supporting all our young people to have a great transition into learning and work. Unfortunately we have a number of young people who remain outside of education, training and employment after leaving school (known as NEET).

We believe:

- Every young person should have the opportunity to learn and fulfil their potential.
- Young people should be supported into adulthood through pathways that offer skills and development.
- Young people should feel valued in the economy, have a sense of belonging and be recognised for the contribution they make.
- Ensure our young people have a sense of citizenship and want to play an active role in their local communities and the economy.
- We are determined that every young person will succeed in Telford and Wrekin and our role is to ensure it is one of the best places in the country for young people to grow, learn, develop and achieve.

We are seeking providers to support our young people through reengagement activities and help support young people to overcome the barriers they face. Typical barriers facing our NEET group may include:

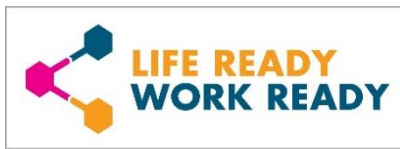
- Lack of confidence
- Limited work history or experience
- Lack of motivation
- Limited qualifications or difficult educational experience
- Mental health concerns including high anxiety
- Other aspects of vulnerability
- Potential behavioural issues

We have funding to support our endeavours. We are looking for programmes that work with our young people in year 12 and 13 who are NEET. Funding available equates to £2000 per young person with the intended outcome being that they reengage and move from NEET into a programme of employment, education or training.

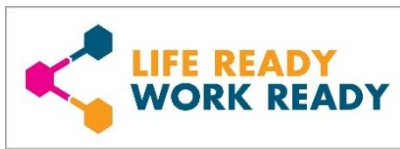
