Network Session Four: Hard to reach schools

It's a deliberately provocative title for a module packed full of great ideas for better engagement with parents, the community and of course learners and it starts with an inspiring case study from The John Frost School...

Network Session Five: Moving on, moving up

This session will get you thinking about the many guises of transition and how we can help our most disadvantaged learners to cope. With case studies and conversations with special guests, it's packed full of research as well as very practical ideas.

Network Session Six: Taking the REINS (reflection, evaluation, impact, next steps)

This session is all about reflection, evaluation, impact and next steps... or 'taking the REINS' as we've called it. In this module we take a wide-ranging look at REINS for learners and staff and a special guest appearance from Mark Finnis which we know you're going to love.

All participants will have access to Challenging Education CPD resources for 12 months to support reflection and implementation and will be able to register for 6 virtual networking sessions that compliment each resource.
