Telford & Wrekin Council (Severn Drive and Whitchurch Road, Wellington) (One-way Street Restriction and Revocation) Traffic Regulation Order 2023

Notice is hereby given that the Borough of Telford & Wrekin in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2), 4(2) and Part III of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with the Act hereby propose to make the following Order.

- 1. It is proposed to introduce a One-way street restriction on the length of road specified in Column 1, where vehicles shall only travel in the direction specified in Column 2 of Schedule 1 to this Notice.
- 2. To revoke the existing One-way Street Restriction listed in the Schedule of Revocation.
- 3. An exemption shall apply to emergency service vehicle when responding to an emergency, taking all due care and attention.

Schedule 1 - (One-way Traffic)	
Column 1	Column 2
1. SEVERN DRIVE; From its junction with Harley Close in a northerly direction for a distance of 16 metres.	From south to north

Schedule 2 - (One-way Traffic)	
Column 1	Column 2
1. SEVERN DRIVE; That length of Severn Drive which extends from its junction with Harley Close for a distance of 126 metres in a northerly direction.	
2. WHITCHURCH ROAD; That length of road which connects Severn Drive with Whitchurch Road and extends from the junction with Severn Drive for a distance of 36 metres in an easterly direction.	

The point of the Order is to amend the length of the existing One-way Street restriction.

Usual exemption shall apply to emergency service vehicle when responding in an emergency.
