Pedagogy and the Contexts for Teaching and Learning

While the EYFS Framework defines the outline of the Curriculum and intentions / outcomes, how this is facilitated belongs to the educators themselves.

The importance of developing a pedagogical repertoire and how this enables effective decision to be taken lies at the heart of ensuring that the Curriculum is accessible and meaningful to the children that you work with.

Using practical examples and acknowledging research and theories, He will explore the features and dimensions of the contexts for teaching and learning in EYFS Provision.

Practical Ideas for Teachers and Practitioners

In this session we will explore ideas for delivering musical sessions for your children.

Delegates will take part in group activities which they can replicate in their settings.

No musical knowledge or skill is needed, the intention is to de-mystify musical learning and encourage delegates to add music to their provision.

The workshop will be run by members of the 'Soundpots' team, part of our local music hub. The team have a wealth of experience in EYFS music delivery and training. Support is given to Early Years Practitioners and parents/carers to develop their skill set and confidence in sharing songs, rhymes and musical play with their children, using a range of engaging activities and resources.

Soundpots won the Primary/Early Years Music category at the Music Teacher Awards for Excellence in 2017.

JAN DUBIEL

"Jan Dubiel is a nationally and internationally recognised specialist in Early Childhood Education."

He was recently identified by the Times Educational Supplement as one of the ten most influential people in British education.

Having trained as an Early Years specialist, Jan worked as a Nursery, Reception and Year 1 teacher and Senior Leader. Following roles as an Early Years Consultant and Senior Adviser, he was appointed by the then Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA) to lead on the management of the (Early Years) Foundation Stage Profile, and had national responsibility for its implementation and moderation, developing guidance and support materials and working at a strategic level with policy makers. Most recently he was the Head of National and International Development at Early

Excellence where he was responsible for developing EExBA, used by 12,000 schools as a Baseline Assessment, EExAT, a Birth to 7 tracking system and EExAQ, an international qualification for Kindergarten teachers.

He is currently Director of Early Years for AISL Harrow International schools and Bilingual Kindergartens and project director for hey! at Hempsall's.

Jan has developed a national and international reputation as a conference speaker, consultant and trainer and he has written widely on different aspects of Early Years policy ,pedagogy and practice. His first book "Effective Assessment in the EYFS" was published by SAGE in 2014.
