OVERVIEW

Brookside ward is situated in the South of the Borough and covers mostly a New Town estate.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 6,923 with some 8.1% of these residents from a BME background (10.6% Borough wide)

The central and south west areas of the ward have high levels of deprivation being in the 10% most deprived of areas nationally.

The proportion of households claiming housing or Council Tax benefits is higher than Borough wide, particularly for those households with dependent children under 20 (18.8% compared to 10.3%). Two out of five children in the ward (40.1%) are eligible for free school meals, almost twice the Borough rate (21.3%).

The proportion of children under 20 in Brookside living in

poverty is higher than Borough wide (39.7% compared to 24.8%), but the proportion of households living in fuel poverty is lower than Borough wide (14.6% compared to 16.7%).

Educational attainment in Brookside is higher than Borough wide at all levels except Key Stage 4 (52.3% compared to 55.0%).

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are higher than Borough wide for all categories with the exception of other acquisitive crime and vehicle crimes. The rate of other crime (11.6 per 1,000 population) is the third highest in the Borough.


Satisfaction levels in Brookside are low across all measures with four of the five showing the lowest score across the Borough. Just 46% of people are satisfied with their local area compared to 76% Borough wide.

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
