

CHURCH ASTON & LILLESHALL WARD PROFILE 2013

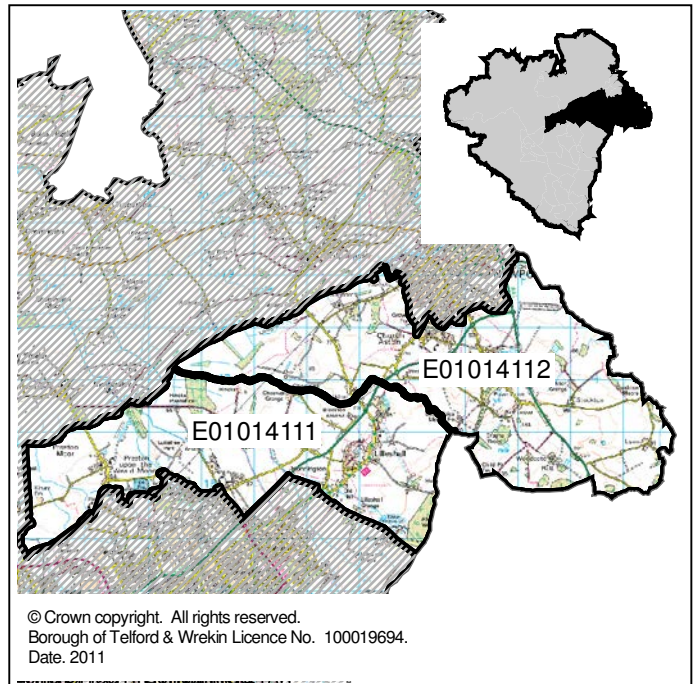
OVERVIEW

Church Aston & Lilleshall ward is situated in the east of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 3,223, with just 5.1% of these residents from a BME background half the Borough average (10.6%).

The proportion of households claiming housing or Council Tax benefits is considerably lower than Borough wide and the ward is amongst the lowest rate for all household types. Just 5.2% of children are eligible for free school meals, a quarter of the Borough rate (21.3%)/

Just 7.7% of children under 20 in Church Aston & Lilleshall are living in poverty, one of the lowest ward rates in the Borough. The proportion of households living in fuel poverty is higher than Borough wide (19.6% compared to 16.7%).



Rates for people claiming job seekers allowance are lower than Borough wide across all categories.

Educational attainment in Church Aston & Lilleshall is higher than the Borough average across all stages. Some 70.3% of pupils achieve a good level of development at Early Year Foundation Stage compared to 55.1% Borough wide. The proportion of pupils achieving a Level 2 or more in Maths and English at Key Stage 2 is similarly high at 93.8% compared to 81.2% Borough wide.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are lower than Borough wide across all categories, with all antisocial behaviour rates amongst the lowest in the Borough.

Satisfaction levels in Church Aston & Lilleshall are higher than the Borough as a whole, in particular satisfaction with the local area (96%) and satisfaction with the way Telford & Wrekin run things (76%) are the highest scores of any ward (76% and 61% Borough wide respectively).

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
