OVERVIEW

Cuckoo Oak ward is situated in the south east of the Borough and covers the housing estate of Sutton Hill and the industrial estate of Halesfield.


The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 5,404 with 8.6% of these residents from a BME background, lower than the Borough figure of 10.6%.

Deprivation levels in Cuckoo Oak are high with three of the four areas ranked in the top 20% most deprived nationally.

The proportion of households claiming housing or Council Tax benefits is higher than Borough wide (43.5% compared to 29.1%). Some 43.1% of children in the ward are eligible for free school meals, twice the Borough figure of 21.3%.

Almost half (46.9%) of all children under 20 in Cuckoo Oak are living in poverty (24.8% Borough wide) with some 18.3% of bouseholds living in fue

wide) with some 18.3% of households living in fuel poverty (16.7%) Borough wide.



The rates of people claiming job seekers allowance within the ward are amongst the highest in the Borough with a total claimant rate of 6.5% (3.6% Borough wide).

Educational attainment within Cuckoo Oak is lower than Borough wide for Key Stages 1 to 4. Less than half (46.3%) of ward pupils achieved 5 GCSEs A*-C including English and Maths, 55.0% Borough wide.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are higher than Borough wide in all categories apart from other acquisitive crime, and are second highest in the Borough for burglaries and criminal damage.

Resident satisfaction with their local area (69%) and Telford and Wrekin as a place to live (58%) is lower than Borough wide (77% and 76% respectively) and amongst the lowest scores in the Borough.

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
