OVERVIEW


Donnington ward is located towards the east of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 6,883 with 8.5% of these residents from a BME background, lower than the Borough rate of 10.6%.

Two of the four areas in Donnington rank within the 20% most deprived areas nationally with all areas of the ward ranking in the 20% most deprived for health deprivation & disability and education, skills & training.

A third (33.8%) of children under 20 in Donnington are living in poverty (24.8% Borough wide) and the ward has the second highest rate of households in fuel poverty at 24.4% (16.7% Borough wide).

Donnington has the highest rate of young females



claiming job seeks allowance (JSA) of any ward in the Borough at 5.0%. Male youth JSA claims, overall youth claims and all age claims are also higher than Borough wide.

Educational attainment in Donnington is similar to the Borough rate for early years foundation stage and key stages 1 and 2, however attainment is considerably lower at Key Stage 4 with 37.9% of pupils in the ward achieving 5 GCSEs A*-C including English and Maths, compared to 55.0% Borough wide.

Crime and antisocial behaviour rates in the ward are lower than Borough wide for all categories except other acquisitive crime (17.9 compared to 16.6 per 1,000 population).

Satisfaction levels in the ward are higher than or in line with Borough scores across all measures. A total of 63% of residents feel the council is making the area a better place to live, ranking second in the Borough.

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
