## **DOTHILL WARD PROFILE 2013**


#### **OVERVIEW**

Dothill is situated in the centre of the Borough to the north of the market town of Wellington.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 2,442, with 7.3% of these residents from a BME background, lower than the 10.6% Borough wide.

Deprivation levels across the ward are split, with the south west portion of the ward in the 20-30% **most** deprived areas nationally and the north east in the 20-30% **least** deprived.

The proportion of households with dependent children claiming housing or Council Tax benefit is higher than Borough wide (22.8% compared to 18.8%), but the proportion of children eligible for free school meals is considerably lower (6.4% compared to 21.3%).



Some 11.5% of children in the ward are living in poverty, less than half the Borough rate of 24.8%.

Dothill has the highest ward rate in the Borough for female youth job seekers allowance claimants at 5.0%. Rates for male youth and all youth claimants are also above Borough figures.

Educational attainment in Dothill at Early Years Foundation Stage is some of the lowest in the Borough with just over a third (36.0%) of pupils achieving a good level of development, compared to 55.1% Borough wide. However attainment at Key Stage 1 is slightly higher than the Borough average (81.2%) with 85.7% of pupils achieving Level 2 or more in English & Maths.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in Dothill are lower than the Borough rates across all categories.

Satisfaction levels in Dothill are similar to the Borough averages for most measures, with the exception of satisfaction with the way Telford & Wrekin run things. Just over half (52%) of Dothill residents were satisfied with the way the Council runs things, compared to 61% Borough wide.

#### **DEPRIVATION**

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
