

EDGMOND WARD PROFILE 2013

OVERVIEW

Edgmond ward is situated in the north east of the Borough, above the town of Newport.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 3,322, with 4.9% of these residents from a BME background, half the Borough rate of 10.6%.

The ward has low levels of deprivation, with the northern area in the 20-30% least deprived and the south in the 10% least deprived nationally.

The proportions of households claiming housing or council tax benefits and children eligible for free school meals are among the lowest in the Borough.

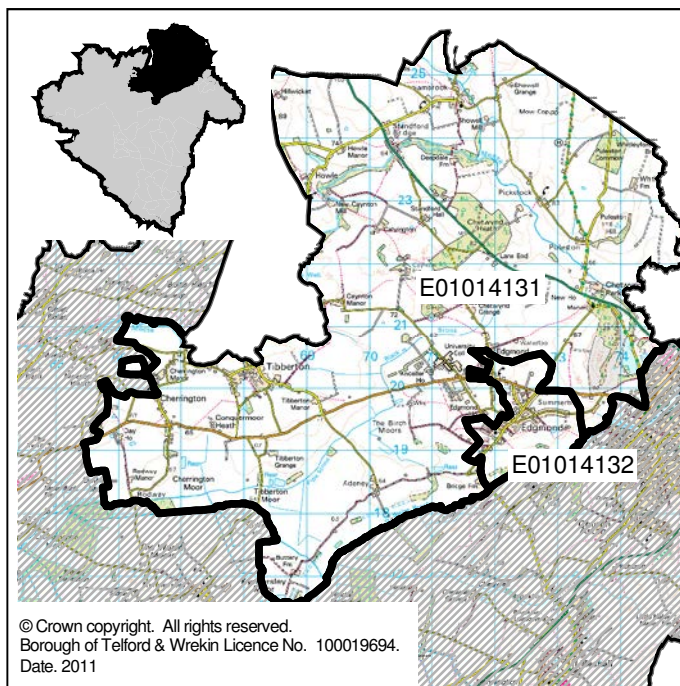
Just 4.6% of children in the ward are living in poverty (24.8% Borough wide) but over a fifth (21.5%) of households are living in fuel poverty (16.7% Borough wide).

Edgmond has the lowest rate of all wards for people claiming job seekers allowance with a total claimant rate of just 0.8% (3.6% Borough wide).

Educational attainment in Edgmond is higher than the Borough average for all stages, with attainment at Early Years Foundation Stage and Key Stage 2 being the highest in the Borough.

Crime and antisocial behaviour rates are lower than Borough wide for all categories, with antisocial behaviour rates being the lowest in Telford and Wrekin.

Satisfaction with the area is high with 90% of people satisfied with their local area and 82% satisfied with Telford and Wrekin (76% and 77% Borough wide respectively). However satisfaction with the Council is low, with just 33% of residents feeling that the Council is making the area a better place to live (49% Borough wide) and 51% satisfied with the way Telford & Wrekin run things (61% Borough wide).



DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
