

HADLEY AND LEEGOMERY WARD PROFILE 2013

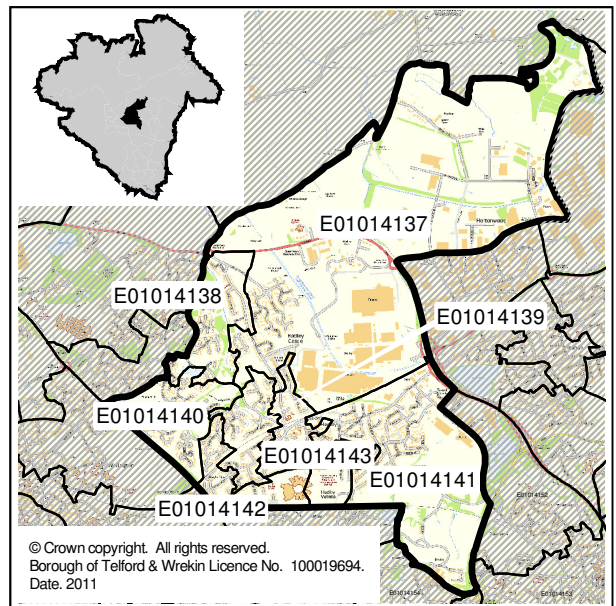
OVERVIEW

Hadley and Leegomery ward is situated in the centre of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 11,565 with over a quarter (26.8%) of these residents coming from a BME background, more than double the Borough rate of 10.6%.

Hadley and Leegomery has a range of deprivation levels with higher deprivation in the south of the ward. Two areas, the south and south west, rank in the 10-20% and 10% most deprived nationally respectively.

The ward has a higher level of households claiming housing and council tax benefits than Borough wide (33.8% compared to 29.1%).



Educational attainment in Hadley and Leegomery is lower than Borough wide across all stages, with key stage 2 attainment the second lowest ward rate (67.1%, 79.3% Borough wide).

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are lower than Borough wide for seven of the ten categories; they are higher for burglaries, criminal damage and vehicle damage.

Satisfaction levels in Hadley and Leegomery are similar to Borough wide for three of the five measures. Satisfaction with Telford and Wrekin as a place to live is higher than the Borough rate (84% compared to 77%) and agreement that the local areas is a place where people from different backgrounds get on well together is lower at 67% (Borough 75%).

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
