

HAYGATE WARD PROFILE 2013

OVERVIEW

Haygate ward is located towards the centre of the Borough and is part of the market town of Wellington, covering the town centre area as well as residential areas.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 3,298 with 13.7% of these residents being from a BME background, higher than the Borough rate of 10.6%.

Both areas of Haygate are in the 20-30% most deprived nationally.

The ward has a high rate of households claiming housing or council tax benefits (39.8%) compared to Borough wide (29.1%).

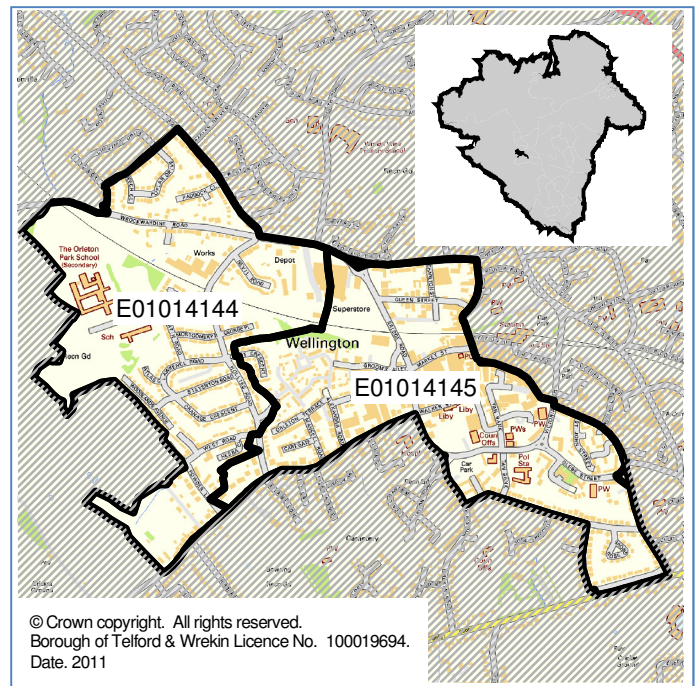
Some 34.6% of children under 20 in Haygate are living in poverty (24.8%) Borough wide, the fifth highest ward rate in the Borough. The number of households living in fuel poverty is also higher than Borough wide (20.6% compared to 16.7%).

The ward has higher rate of people claiming job seeker allowance (JSA) than Borough wide, in particular it has the highest rate of any ward for youth claimants (17.5%, 8.9% Borough wide).

Educational attainment in Haygate is lower than the Borough average for all stages except Key Stage 2.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are higher than Borough wide across all categories with the total antisocial behaviour rate more than twice than of the Borough (155.0, compared to 64.0).

Satisfaction levels in Haygate are fairly similar to those Borough wide. The percentage of ward residents who agree that their area is a place where people from different backgrounds get on well together (69%) is lower than Borough wide (75%).



DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
