

HORSEHAY AND LIGHTMOOR WARD PROFILE 2013

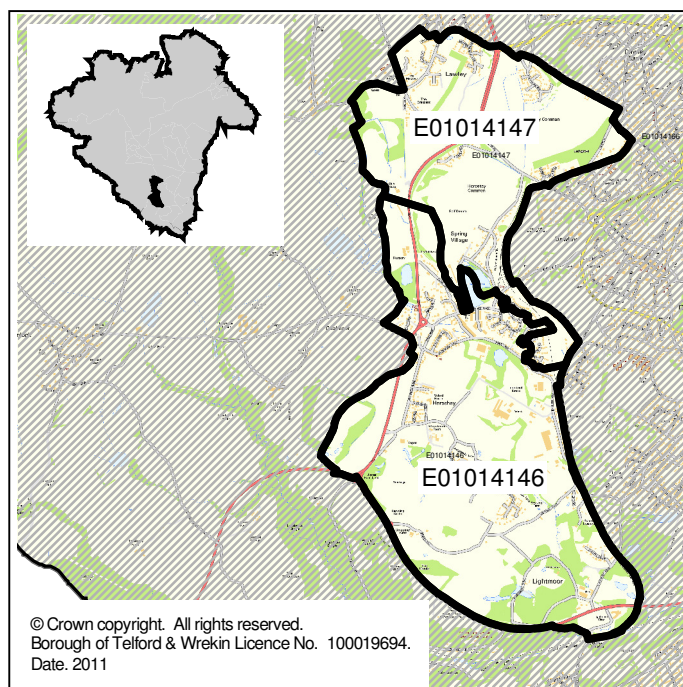
OVERVIEW

Horsehay and Lightmoor ward is located towards the south of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 4,292, with 6.3% of these residents from a BME background, less than the Borough rate of 10.6%.

Horsehay and Lightmoor has low levels of deprivation with the southern area in the 30-40% least deprived and the northern in the 20-30% least deprived.

The ward has a lower rate of households claiming housing and council tax benefit than Borough wide (17.2% compared to 29.1%) and a lower proportion of children eligible for free school meals (11.3% compare to 21.3%)



Rates of fuel poverty and children living in poverty within Horsehay and Lightmoor are lower than across Telford and Wrekin as are rates of people claiming job seekers allowance.

Educational attainment in the ward is higher than Borough wide for all stages apart from Key Stage 4. Almost three quarters (73.0%) of pupils in the ward achieved a good level of development in Early Years Foundation, considerably higher than the 55.1% Borough wide, and the third highest ward rate.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in Horsehay and Lightmoor are below Borough figures for all categories apart from burglaries at 11.2 per 1,000 population (8.7 Borough wide).

Satisfaction levels in the ward are higher than average across four of the five measures, but rank in the lowest ward scores for the percentage of people who agree that their area is a place where people from different backgrounds get on well together (62%, 75% Borough wide).

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
