

MALINSLEE WARD PROFILE 2013

OVERVIEW

Malinslee ward is located in the south of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 6,106, with 9.6% of these residents from a BME background slightly lower than the Borough wide 10.6%.

Malinslee has high levels of deprivation with three of its four areas in the 10% most deprived nationally.

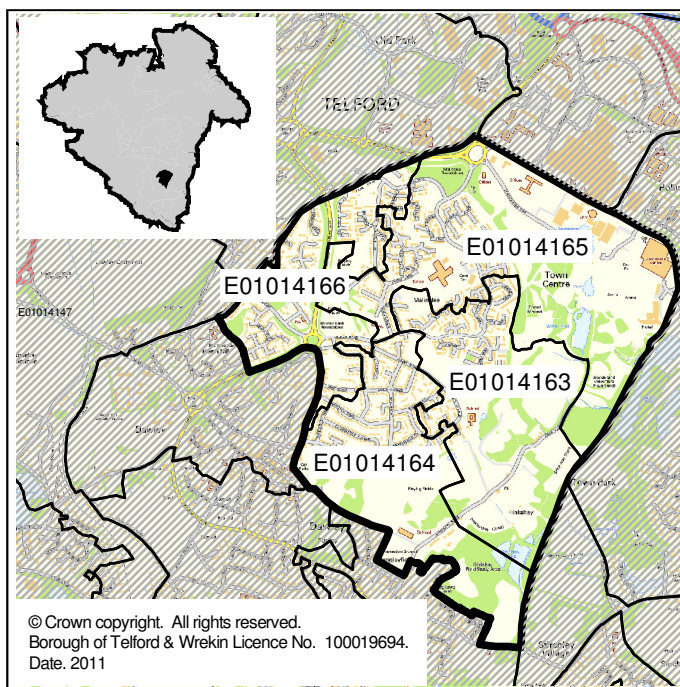
The ward has high proportion so of households claiming housing and council tax benefits, children eligible for free school meals and children living in poverty.

Rates of people claiming job seekers allowance are some of the highest in the Borough (6.5%, 3.6% Borough wide) with youth claimant rates also high (14.3% compared to 8.9%).

Educational attainment in Malinslee is some of the lowest in the Borough with attainment lower than Borough wide across all key stages. Less than a third (32.3%) of Early Years Foundation Stage pupils achieved a good level of development (55.1 Borough wide) and just over a quarter (27.9%) of Key Stage 4 pupils achieved 5 GCSEs A*-C including English and Maths, almost half the Borough rate (55.0%)

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are higher than Borough wide across all categories apart from other acquisitive crime.

Malinslee has the highest ward rate for residents feeling the Council is making the area a better place to live (63%, 49% Borough wide), but satisfaction with their local area as a place to live is lower than Borough wide (70% compared to 76%).



DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
