

# MUXTON WARD PROFILE 2013

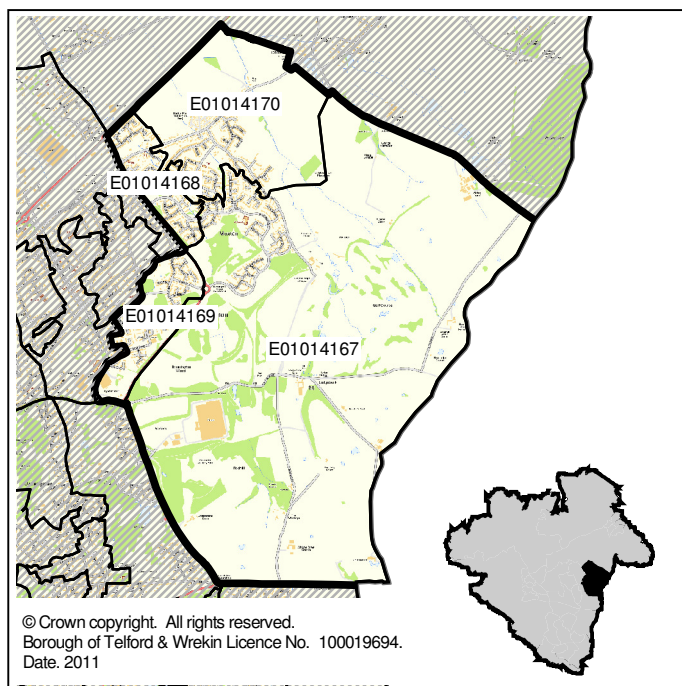
## OVERVIEW

Muxton ward is situated in the east of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 6,557, with 8.8% of these residents from a BME background, lower than the 10.6% Borough wide.

The western part of the ward is more deprived being ranked in the 20-30% **most** deprived, with the rest of the ward in the 30% **least** deprived.

Muxton has a lower than average proportion of households claiming housing or council tax benefits (17.6%) and children eligible for free school meals (11.5%) compared to Borough wide (29.1% and 21.3% respectively). The rate of households without children claiming benefits is one of the lowest in the Borough (9.0%).



The ward has a smaller proportion of children living in poverty than Borough wide, and one of the lowest ward rates of households living in fuel poverty (10.5% compared to 16.7%).

Educational attainment in Muxton is higher than the Borough average across all key stages, in particular the percentage of Key Stage 2 pupils achieving level 4 or more in English and Maths (92.2%) is one of the highest in the Borough (79.3%).

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are lower than Borough wide across all categories except other acquisitive crime (17.1 per 1,000 population).

Muxton has the highest score of any ward for residents who agree that their area is a place where people from different backgrounds get on well together (95%, 75% Borough wide)

## DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
