
OVERVIEW

Newport East ward is situated in the north East of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 2,826, with just 3.5% of these residents from a BME background, a third of the Borough rate (10.6%).

The western part of the ward is ranked in the 40-50% **most** deprived and is more deprived than the eastern part, ranked 10-20% **least** deprived.

Newport East has lower than average proportions of households claiming benefits, children eligible for free school meals and children living in poverty.



The proportion of people claiming job seeks allowance (JSA) in the ward is low (1.4% compared to 3.6%) with the rate of youth claimants (3.3%) one of the lowest in the Borough (8.9%).

Educational attainment in Newport East is higher than Borough wide across all key stages. In particular the percentage of Early Years Foundation Stage pupils achieving a good level of development (87.0%) is one of the highest in the Borough.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are lower than Borough wide across all categories, with four out of the ten categories, burglaries, other acquisitive crime, other crime and total antisocial behaviour, being some of the lowest ward rates seen across the Borough.

Satisfaction levels in Newport East are similar to Borough wide, with a slightly higher percentage of residents feeling that the Council is making the area a better place to live (55% compared to 49% Borough wide).

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
