
OVERVIEW

Newport North ward is located in the north east of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 3,177, with 3.5% of these residents from a BME background, a third of the Borough rate (10.6%).

Deprivation in Newport North is low with the western part of the ward in the 40-50% least deprived and the eastern part in the 10% least deprived.

Rates of households claiming benefits, children eligible for free school meals, children living in poverty and households in fuel poverty, are all lower than Borough wide.



The proportion of people from Newport North claiming job seekers allowance (1.6%) is lower than Borough wide (3.6%) as is the percentage of youth claimants (5.0% compared to 8.9%).

Educational attainment in the ward is higher than the Borough average across all key stages, with attainment at Key Stage 1 (97.0% of pupils achieving level 2 or more in English and Maths) the highest of any Borough ward.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in Newport North are lower than Borough wide across all categories, with three of the ten categories recording the lowest rates of any ward.

Satisfaction levels in Newport North are higher than Borough wide, with 96% of residents satisfied with their local area (76% Borough wide), and 72% satisfied with the way Telford and Wrekin run things (61% Borough wide), some of the highest scores across the Borough.

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
