
OVERVIEW

Newport South is situated in the north east of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 2,635 with 3.5% of these residents from a BME background, a third of the Borough figures (10.6%).

Both areas of Newport South are less deprived than the national average with the south west area in the 10-20% least deprived.

The ward has a lower proportion of households claiming housing or council tax benefits than Borough wide, a lower percentage of children eligible for free school meals and a lower percentage of children living in poverty.



The rate of people claiming job seekers allowance in Newport South is one of the lowest ward rates across the Borough at 1.3% (3.6% Borough wide).

Educational attainment in the ward is higher than Borough wide for Early Year Foundation Stage but one of the lowest ward rates for Key Stage 1 with just 68.2% of pupils achieving level 2 or more in English and Maths, compared to 81.2% Borough wide.

Crime and antisocial behaviour rates in Newport South are lower than Borough wide across all categories except criminal damage. Rates for vehicle crime and other crime are some of the lowest in the Borough.

Satisfaction levels in the ward are higher than average across all measures, with the proportion of people satisfied with Telford and Wrekin as a place to live and the proportion of people who feel the Council is making the area a better place to live, among the highest rates in the Borough.

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
