
OVERVIEW

Newport West is located in the north east of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 2,898 with 6.3% of these residents from a BME background.

Deprivation levels in the ward are mixed with the south west area in the 10% **least** deprived and the north east area in the 40-50% **most** deprived.

Newport West has lower than average proportions of households claiming housing or council tax benefits, children eligible for free school meals, children living in poverty and households in fuel poverty.



Just 2.1% of working age residents are claiming job seekers allowance (JSA) lower than the 3.6% Borough wide and the youth JSA claimant rate is ne of the lowest in the Borough at 3.3% (8.9% Borough wide).

Educational attainment in Newport West is higher than Borough wide for all key stages apart from Early Years Foundation Stage. Attainment at Key stage 1 and Key Stage 4 is among the highest in the Borough.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are mixed with the rate of burglaries one of the lowest in the Borough and the rate of other acquisitive crime one of the highest. Rates of antisocial behaviour are lower than Borough wide.

Satisfaction levels in Newport West are similar to Borough wide for four of the five measures, with a higher percentage than average satisfied with their local area (83% compared to 76% Borough wide).

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
