

PARK WARD PROFILE 2013

OVERVIEW

Park ward is located in the centre of the Borough

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 2,526 with 5.2% of these residents from a BME background, half the Borough rate (10.6%).

Deprivation in the west of the ward is fairly low being ranked in the 20-30% least deprived, with the eastern area more deprived being ranked in the 40-50% most deprived.

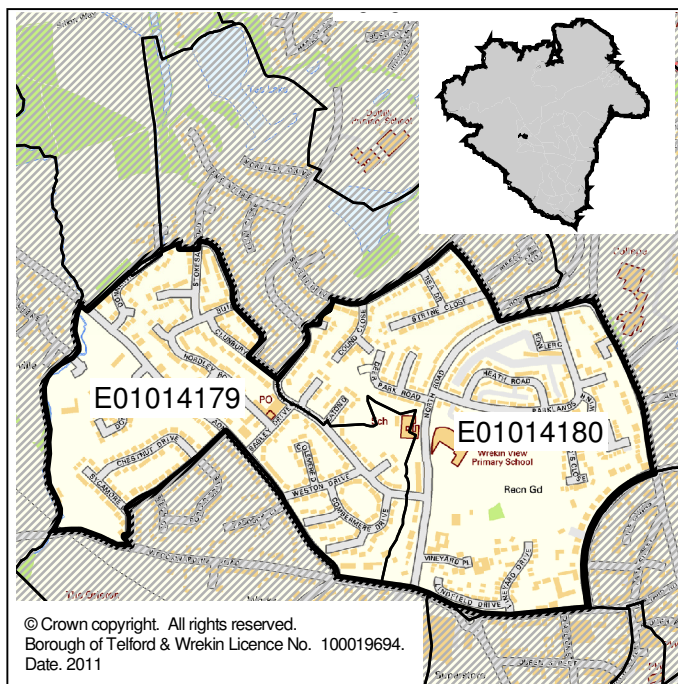
Park has a lower proportion of households claiming housing or council tax benefits, children eligible for free school meals and children living in poverty than Borough wide, but a slightly higher rate of households in fuel poverty (18.7% compared to 16.7%).

The rate of people claiming job seekers allowance (JSA) in the ward (1.8%) is half that of the Borough rate (3.6%) with the rate of male youth JSA claimants one of the lowest in the Borough at 2.5%.

Educational attainment in Park is above the Borough rate for all key stages with the exception of Early Years Foundation Stage where 44.4% of pupils in the ward achieved a good level of development compared to 55.1% Borough wide.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are lower than Borough wide across all categories, with burglaries being one of the lowest ward rates in the Borough.

More than three quarters of Park residents are satisfied with their local area as a place to live, similar to the 76% Borough wide, but just 58% agree that their area is a place where people from different backgrounds get on well together (75% Borough wide), one of the lowest ward rates.



DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
